


Many Swiss living abroad have complained that, on their definitive return to Switzerland, the cost of joining a Swiss sickness fund is almost prohibitive, especially for applicants well advanced in years. And the social agreements between

Switzerland and various other countries certainly do not enable this yawning gap in our social insurance system to be closed.

From 1st January 1988 this will change. For almost 30 years now, the Solidarity Fund for the Swiss Abroad has been performing the task of rendering material rehabilitation assistance to compatriots abroad who have lost their livelihood as a result of political events. Further, members of the Fund benefit from advantageous and secure savings facilities in Switzerland.
