Regarding Nationality of Children of Swiss Women Abroad

Children born before 1st July 1985 but after the 31st December 1952 can still apply up to the end of June 1988 for recognition as Swiss citizens. Owing to phe tremendous number of applications received, the responsible Swiss authorities, are considerably behind (in some cases up to two years) in dealing with them.

Those applicants who have still not received the cantonal decision are requested to refrain from sending enquiries about this matter to the Embassy.

It is pointed out;

- That you can regard the application has having been forwarded to Switzerland if your cheque covering the fees has been paid in by the Embassy.
- That all applications paid for and submitted by the end of June 1988 are legally valid even if the cantonal decision is taken after that date.

On 18th February, an Open Meeting took place at the Swiss Embassy Lecture Hall, organised jointly by the City Swiss Club and the new Helvetic Society, supported by members of the Unione Ticinese and the Swiss Mercantile Society. Sir John Wraight, KBE, CMG, former British Ambassador to Switzerland, addressed the large gathering on the historical relationship between the two countries, especially in the City of London.

MEMORIAL CONCERT FOR ALBERT FERBER

In the June 1987 issue of the Review an obituary appeared giving an appreciation of the well-known Swiss concert pianist Albert Ferber, his life in this country and his distinguished career which had taken him all over the world.

Four of his former pupils gave a Memorial Concert for their revered teacher at the Wigmore Hall on the 25th February. A number of works (Beethoven, Schubert, Fauré, Debussy and Rachmaninoff) which the artist himself had played so many times, were expertly performed.

The most moving item on the programme were six songs by Verlaine, which Ferber had set to music during the last four years of his life when a cruel illness prevented him from playing the piano. The music first performance- was most impressive, making great demands both on soprano and piano. The last of the songs Ferber wrote three weeks before he died. It was a gripping and sad farewell.

The concert was a fitting tribute to a great pianist and the Hall was filled with friends and admirers.

The organisers are most grateful to the Credit Suisse, London, for their generous sponsorship. This enabled them to pass on all the admission receipts to the Department of Radiotherapy and Oncology of the University Hospital.
