OBITUARY.

With deepest regret we have to record the death of one of our members and an old pioneer of Taranaki, Mr. John Steiner, Sen. of Mangatoki where he was greatly respected as a highly practical and successful farmer.

Born in Zug, Switzerland, 64 years ago as the third son of the late Karl and Catharine Steiner, he emigrated to New Zealand in 1902 where he spent his early days in Inglewood, moving later to Mahoe and Mangatoki.

Our late Compatriot was married twice, his first wife predeceasing him by 14 years. His second wife, Mrs. Jean Steiner and 8 children mourn this great loss. They are John and Eddie, Mahoe, Hermann and Trevor, Mangatoki, Mrs. L. Schmid, Mrs. John Schupfer, Mrs. J. Tohn and Mrs. W. Waldvogel. He also leaves two brothers, Messrs. Oswald and Charlie Steiner, two sisters, Mesdames Jas. Werder of Waitoa and Butler of Switzerland and 11 grandchildren.

The funeral which took place at Kaponga on 22nd April was the largest seen at Kaponga for many years. Pall bearers were his sons, John, Hermann and Eddie and his sons-in-law, J. Schupfer, J. Tohn, W. Waldvogel.
