

PICNICS OF THE LAST CENTURY

When the subject of the Hamilton Swiss Picnic is brought up, many of you will automatically think of the very picturesque country surrounding at Kiwitahi which was the venue for our picnics for the last 26 years. It is with sincere appreciation that we thank Yolanda and the late John Villiger and their families for letting the club use their farm for the picnic. Many people will have vivid memories of meeting up with lots of people, having many conversations, or being particularly lucky at Kegel or Shotput. I believe the first picnic was held in Kiwitahi in 1974 and that particular year we had the swiss national rowing team join in for the day's activities. In the earlier years Schwingen was also organised with participants coming from Taranki as well as the odd visitor from Switerland.

According to the booklet published

for the Club's 40th Anniversary, there were annual picnics held at Mercer from 1958 and at Scheidegger's farm in Matamata. From 1961 to 1973 the picnics were held at Risi's Mountly Piggery in Ngaruawahia. I'm sure that era also brings back many fond memories. I remember that the Mueller Family were in charge of selling the drinks and the Staheli Family sold icecreams. They also used to put up a dance stage and the swiss group used to perform some traditional swiss dancing. I believe a soccer match was also part of the entertainment for a few years, as well as tug-of-war for the children. In those days the sausages used to be cooked over an open fire until the era of gas barbeques came along. Many thanks to all those who contributed to picnics of the last century. Who knows what the picnics of this century will bring and what memories will be left for the old and young alike. AZ.

The following explanation is underlining the importance of these contracts;

The ratification of the seven contracts with the EU comes at the end of a four-year working period between Switzerland and the EU. The seven areas of contractual arrangements are;

- * Free movements of people
- * Road traffic
- * Air traffic
- * Research
- * Agricultural products
- * open markets
- * restrictions on commerce.

Not only is Switzerland often called "the heart of Europe" in geographical terms, but in many ways it also fits this description in commercial, political, historic and cultural realms.

The new bi-lateral contracts will bring a new quality to the relationship between Switzerland and the EU. - Let us not forget that twothirds of our foreign (external) commerce is bound up within the EU. The seven contracts are mainly of an economic nature and as such will help to keep the European market open for the young entrepreneurs of Switzerland
