

### **Donations**

On behalf of the Swiss Society of New Zealand, I would like to thank the New Zealand Community Trust and the Taranaki Electricity Trust very much for their generous donations towards compiling our magazine, the Helvetia. It is hoped that in the near future we will run a competition for our younger members as an educational programme. As a non-profit organisation, we are very grateful for any donations.

For those of you who don't know, The Taranaki Electricity Trust is a Charitable Trust which was formed in 1993. The Trust receives dividend income from Powerco Limited. The dividend income is distributed by way of grants to suitable applicants from the area previously supplied by the Taranaki Electric Power Board. The policy of the Trust is to distribute all of its net income to suitable applicants by way of discretionary grants. By distributing funds to as wide a range of applicants as possible, it is hoped that the income will be returned to the community which originally built the power company.
