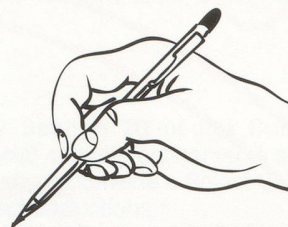

**Address by the Society Patron - Mrs Sylvie Matteucci-Keller** addressed the gathering on various issues affecting Swiss Abroad, and informed us that she will soon be retiring to live in Switzerland (the full report was printed in the July '05 issue of the Helvetia).

**Financial Report:** Copies of the financial report were circulated and Marianne reported on Walter's behalf that we had a good increase of income over expenditure by \$7,407.56. This was due to the very generous donations we received from the Taranaki Electricity Trust, The NZ Community Trust and the Lottery Grants Board together with good income obtained, once again, through our very loyal advertisers. Please support our advertisers whenever possible. Accumulated funds now stand at a very healthy \$45,095.90.

**Matter arising:** Hans Vetsch asked whether the Swiss Society had a policy in place regarding the use of surplus funds. Marianne advised that there was no policy in place, but funds were kept in case of future losses. In recent years, without donations being applied for and approved, the Society would make an annual loss. With the healthy accumulated funds we can retain subscriptions at the current level. Heinz Leuenberger felt it was prudent to retain funds in case of it being required for unforeseen matters.

**Delegate for the Swiss Abroad's Report:** Heinz Leuenberger reported that he has continued working on the issue of the AHV versus NZ Super Annuation with little success at the moment. This issue was then discussed at length. Hans Fitz advised that WINZ were doing it right by the law of the country, and felt that the only way to get the matter further investigated is through the Swiss Embassy. Mrs Matteucci advised that they have been working on the issue, but the NZ government is currently not interested in negotiating a new law change. Trudi Fill felt that new immigrants should be made aware of the AHV issue, and Mrs Matteucci felt that this was a good idea. Mrs Matteucci advised that she will give feedback to the Ministry in Berne about the issues we have raised. Heinz moved his report for adoption.

**Helvetia:** Trudi Fill thanked the Swiss Society executive for their work. As past secretary of the Auckland Swiss Club she felt that too much emphasis in the Helvetia was on "Taranaki", that her Auckland reports were edited and that their photos were downsized, unclear and in black and white. Marianne replied that reports were never edited, and that the only coloured photographs were in a 16 page issue when there was a middle page spread. Unfortunately when club articles aren't lengthy, we have to fill the magazine with a variety of other articles. Rinaldo appreciated the difficulty in finding material to print, and suggested that we could use articles printed in Swiss Info. Silvia advised that she would look into this. We would also like to remind all our card players that to win the Jass Trophy you must be a financial member of the Hamilton Swiss Club.

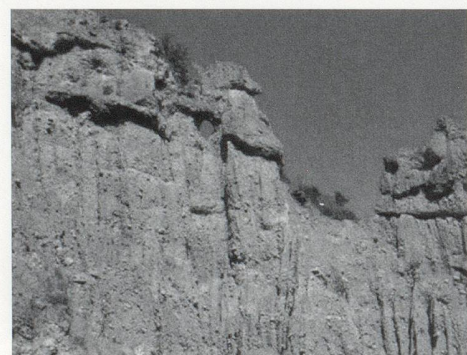
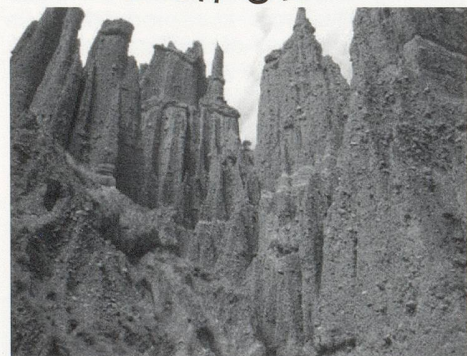
## Shooting Update:

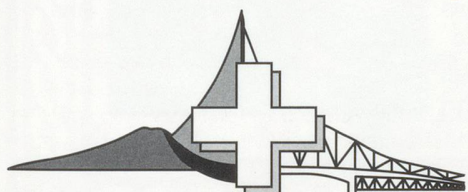
