After Thun (1995), Sierre (2000) and Frauenfeld (2005) it is now the region of Aarau that invites all Swiss shooters and Swiss-Abroad shooters to the biggest shooting competition in the world. Some 50'000 shooters will participate. 350 shooters will be there from abroad. I would like to invite all Swiss shooters from all over NZ. It is my 7th attendance and I am able to do the organisation. Rifles (K31, STG57. STG90) can be provided on the day.

The Swiss Abroad Shooting Competition will be held on Saturday 3 July 2010.

Due to the complexity of the organisation of this event I will have to reserve targets according to the number of shooters participating from New Zealand. I also have to apply for your private Sport-Association Number. Please let me know ASAP.

We will be shooting some private competition on Friday 2 July 2010, preferably on the same range as the Swiss-Abroad Competition.
