Tip No. 1 Enjoy a sunny spring day on Mount Tamaro:

There is something for young and old!


The "Monte Tamaro" mountain is located in the Lugano-Bellinzona-Locarno triangle. From Rivera, which is easily accessible by car and public transport, a convenient cableway whisks you up to Alpe Foppa at 1,530 metres above sea level. With its big restaurant and the Church of S. Maria degli Angeli (designed by architect Mario Botta), Alpe Foppa is the starting point for walks with panoramic views, as well as being home to an innovative play park for kids, Alpine coaster bobs, a flying fox and a new track for downhill fans. The Adventure Park, meeting point with snack bar and the Bike Park are situated at the cableway's middle station.

Tip No. 2 Bicycling in the Magadino Plain

The Magadino Plain is perfect for bicycling. Taking the well marked Bellinzona-Ascona bicycle path allows you to decide your own route. You can relax and enjoy the landscape in the midst of Nature at one of several picnic spots along the Ticino river banks, at some farms or in indicated spots, or for those who are very hungry, several restaurants serve the "Piatto del Piano" (the Plain dish) of local products at a reasonable price.

Tip No. 3 Explore cultural and scenic trails in and around Bellinzona

The Bellinzona Tourism Office offers a wide range of ideas on what to do in and around Bellinzona. Under the theme "Bellinzona - non solo Castelli" (not only castles), the Office promotes the region's natural beauty spots and landmarks through a 200km network of hiking paths. A number of fabulous cultural and scenic trails are on offer. These include the "The Hunger Towers in Camorino", "la Via delle Vigne sulle colline di Gudo" (wine trail) and the "Heart of the Turrta". This is a walk through central Bellinzona, with its beautiful Piazza Nosetto ("Walnut Square") and Town Hall.
