SWISS CATHOLIC'S "BETTAG" SERVICE.

Each year on the third Sunday in September in Switzerland, all organised sport and big amusements are suspended and the people, Catholics and Protestants alike, are called to special services of Atonement and prayer. It is fitting that we Swiss in London too should remember this day and the Chaplain's call to a special Service at St. Anne's Church was well answered.

The solemn High Mass was sung by the Rev. Dom. Thomas Boos O.S.B. of Quarr Abbey, Isle of Wight, where the Monks sing the Liturgy of the Church in full choir every day. It was the first time in the Swiss Catholic Missions existence that an Anglo-Swiss Priest was celebrant on such an occasion.

The singing of the Choir too was very impressive although some of the members were absent on holiday.

The Chaplain, Fr. Lanfranchi, in his sermon in English and German stressed the value of prayer, in good and bad time, in sickness and in health. "Whatever you ask in His name shall be given unto you".

It is in God's name that the Swiss Confederation was founded and the Swiss Constitution even today begins with the supplication of Almighty God. It is up to all of us to follow this Christian example.

The Church of St. Anne's was well decorated with flowers and the Swiss and British flags.

The worshippers had the opportunity to see what great improvements have been effected in the Church since the Chaplain took charge just over a year ago. Much more however needs doing and in particular the

Heating Plant needs renewing and the organ needs repairs etc. All this costs money and the Chaplain therefore made a strong appeal for donation for funds.

Moreover a special "bazaar" is being organised in conjunction with the parishioners and the Swiss Catholic Community and we refer to the announcement and advertisement on another page about this forthcoming event.

A Concert of Sacred Music will be held at The Westminster Cathedral Hall, Victoria, S.W.1. on Sunday October 18th at 8.0 p.m. (tickets from the Chaplain at St. Anne's Church) the proceeds being shared by the St. Anne's and St. Boniface's (German Catholic Church, E.1.) to which a special invitation is given to all.
