Market women in national costumes — lace, billowing petticoats and embroidered aprons — add a genuine 17th-century touch to the Old Town of Lausanne, where they appear twice a week, on Wednesdays and Saturdays, for the colourful open-air market, much to the delight of picture-shooting tourists.

In addition to the 500 ski-lifts, chair-lifts and aerial cableways already in permanent use in Switzerland's approximately 125 winter sports resorts last winter, it is estimated that more than twenty new ones will be ready at the start of the new season to carry the ever-increasing numbers of skiers. The new installations so far announced are distributed among Switzerland's most important skiing areas and some of them open up new ski fields. They include the following: — Davos: Parsennhütte-Weissfluhjoch aerial cableway, Kreuzweg-Parsenfurka ski-lift; Grindelwald: First-Oberjoch ski-lift; Andermatt: Andermatt-Gemsstock Gotthard cableway; Charmey (Canton Fribourg): Charmey-Dents-Verts cableway.
