Soon after his arrival in this country, he joined the Swiss Mercantile Society of which he has been a member ever since, and a faithful member of the General Purposes and House Committee. He was also a member of the Nouvelle Société Helvétique and he joined the City Swiss Club in October 1921. His business life was spent in textiles. A few years ago, he retired, and spent much of his time at Andeer in the Grisons.

THE NATIONAL DAY ON THE ISLE OF WIGHT

The Swiss of the Isle of Wight have also been celebrating the 1st August. Mr. and Mrs. Walter Zuber, a Swiss family established in the Isle of Wight for 40 years, invited their compatriots on the island to a traditional National Day Celebration. The small party read out the 1st August message by the President of the Confederation in German and in English. They then enjoyed hospitable rolls, cakes and drinks offered to them by their hosts. A symbolical fire was lit in the garden, the Swiss flag was raised, and all sang melodies from home. It was a gay and peaceful evening.

SWITZERLAND GETS A BEATING IN HOCKEY

Switzerland met England at St. Albans on August 15th and two days later at Weybridge and were successively beaten 2-0 and 1-0. The matches were part of the European Hockey Cup which, according to English experts, Switzerland never had a chance of winning. The "Observer" and the "Times" were present at St. Albans, and appeared to be the only newspapers on the spot besides the "Hertfordshire Advertiser" and the "Swiss Observer"! Their rating of the game was that England played poorly and should have beaten a weak Swiss team by a higher score. The Swiss all come out badly except for his goalkeeper Monnard, who despite his name plays for Lucerne. A surprise in the Swiss team list was that 7 out of 14 players selected came from Wettingen (Ag). Hockey is very much a player's game and the crowd at Clarence Park barely exceeded 400. It was a quiet and uninvolved crowd, hardly needing to cry out in support of the English team, since its superiority and control of the field was

so obvious. The English had their "Bobby Moore" in M. W. Corby who led nearly all their onslaughts and scored the first goal on a penalty. This match was the first of its kind between England and Switzerland.
