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First Announcement

Seventh International Congress of Protozoology, 22–29 June, 1985

Kenyatta International Conference Centre, Nairobi, Kenya

The Congress will be held in Africa for the first time and will be open to scientists from all over the world involved in studies of various aspects of both free-living and parasitic protozoa.

The Program will include: (A) Two major Round-Table Discussions; (B) Fifteen Symposia; (C) Contributed-Paper and Poster Sessions.

- A. The Round-Table Discussions are to deal with:

 Phylogeny and Evolution of Protozoa

 Application of New Techniques in Identification of Protozoa
- B. and C. The 15 Symposia and the Contributed-Paper and Poster Sessions will be devoted to structural, functional, and ecological aspects of free-living and parasitic protozoa. The topics to be discussed at the Symposia and the chairmen and co-chairmen will be listed in the Second Announcement. Also included will be a list of the subjects to be covered at the Contributed-Paper and Poster Sessions.

In addition to the Congress, there are scheduled three satellite Post-Congress Conferences. Two of these, one on *Malaria* and the other on *Terminology, Taxonomy and Life Cycles of Apicomplexa (Coccidia)*, are to be held in Nairobi. The third, an *International Symposium on Trichomonads and Trichomoniasis*, will take place in Prague, Czechoslovakia (3–7 July, 1985).

There will also be two Post-Congress Workshops (in Mombasa and Kisumu, Kenya) dealing with *Ecology of Marine and Fresh-Water Protozoa*.

Registration fees for the Congress received in Nairobi before 31 January, 1985 (excluding the two Post-Congress conferences, the Trichomoniasis Symposium in Prague, and the workshops) will be U.S. \$ 100.00 for active participants, U.S. \$ 40.00 for accompanying persons, and U.S. \$ 25.00 for students. Higher fees will be assessed for late registration.

Instructions to authors (revised September 1982)

Manuscripts in English, German or French should be submitted in duplicate (i.e. the original with one copy, and three sets of illustrations) to Acta Tropica, Swiss Tropical Institute, Socinstrasse 57, CH-4051 Basel, Switzerland. They will be sent, as a rule, to two referees. The decision to accept, revise, or refuse a paper will be made by the editors. The editors assume that papers submitted to Acta Tropica have not been and will not be published elsewhere.

The *manuscripts* should be typewritten double-spaced with a wide margin. Original papers **should not exceed 10 printed pages** including tables and figures. Exceptionally, the editors may accept larger manuscripts. The authors are charged for exceeding pages at a rate of sFr. 150.— per page.

Original papers should be organized as follows: Summary – up to 5 Key words – Introduction – Material (or Patients) and Methods – Results – Discussion – Acknowledgments – References.

A short and precise *summary* only in English must precede original papers and review articles and contain the essential information. For papers written in German or French the summary should be more detailed and must be preceded by the English translation of the title.

Short communications are only accepted in English and may not exceed 2 printed pages including tables and figures.

Bibliographical references in the text should be given by the name of author(s) and the year of publication. In the case of 3 or more authors they are cited in the text: (Meier et al., 1983). The list of references at the end of the paper should be arranged in alphabetical order of the authors, featuring name and initials of authors, full title of paper, name of journal, followed by volume, page(s), and year of publication. For books the name and address of the publishers should also be mentioned.

Tables and figures should be added to the manuscript on separate sheets and numbered, legends of tables and figures being on a special sheet. In view of production costs, the number of figures and tables must be restricted to an irreducible minimum. Only 3 pages of half-tone illustrations per manuscript will be accepted. Additional half-tone pages will be charged for at a rate of sFr. 150.—per page. Color plates can be reproduced only as an exception and at the author's expense.

Photographs must be presented on glossy paper in three complete sets. In the first 2 sets labels and explanatory marks to be added should be indicated with black or white transfer letters. Photographs must be arranged into groups and mounted on a white board in camera-ready form (maximal size: 11.7×17.6 cm). The third set will consist simply of the photographs, unmounted, with no additions at all, only numbered on the back.

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
