

Swiss Literary Archives

BOESCH, Hans (1926–2003): Correspondence and two recordings with interviews. (Donation of Elio Pellin)

BORGEAUD, Georges (1914–1998): Georges Borgeaud art collection, including pieces by Bosshard, Castro, Chagall, Chinet, Lesieur, Palézieux and Severini. (Donation of the Fondation Calvignac)

CENDRARS, Blaise (1887–1961): Hughes Richard collection: 14 letters and postcards from Blaise Cendrars to Paul Haberbosch (1902–1909), bibliographic notebook on Blaise Cendrars, established by Hughes Richard.

–: *Une nuit dans la forêt*: Collection of some 120 handwritten, typed and printed documents (1926–1931) concerning publication of the work by Verseau.

HALPERIN, Josef (1891–1963): Documentation of his work as a journalist, manuscripts of his forays into literature as well as voluminous correspondence. Letters from Friedrich Glauser to Josef Halperin are not in the SLA, but rather in private possession. (On deposit for the Robert Walser Foundation, Bern)

HÄNNY, Reto (*1947): Letters and literary documents such as workbooks, manuscripts and typescripts, computer printouts and artist's books (or "book objects"), unpublished book projects. Documentation of collaboration with visual artists, musicians and film-makers.


HENNINGS, Emmy (1885–1948): Estate of Emmy Hennings and Hugo Ball (1886–1927). Typescripts related to Hennings's publications, unpublished texts (e.g. sections of a "prison" trilogy) and shorter prose works as well as feature articles and reviews, and a photograph collection comprising several hundred prints of the author's (self-) portraits. Ball's authors' library and collection of excerpts, a collection of reproductions of war photographs, constitutional document entitled *Das erste dadaistische Manifest* ("The first Dadaist manifesto"), Ball's death mask, more than 1200 letters and a collection of autographs. (On deposit for the Robert Walser Foundation, Bern)

JOHANSEN, Hanna (*1939): Letters and literary documents such as notebooks, manuscripts and typescripts of the early stories and first works up to and including *Der schwarze Schirm* (2007). Special focus on books for children and young people and their translations.

LOOSLI, Carl Albert (1877–1959): Work manuscripts, letters from and to C. A. Loosli and individual vital documents. (Donation of Erwin Marti)

PULVER, Elsbeth (*1928): Manuscripts of Pulver's studies in literary criticism as well as her abundant correspondence with the leading Swiss authors of the 20th century.

RILKE, Rainer Maria (1875–1926): Handwritten letter from Rilke to the painter Rudolf F. Burckhardt, Val-Mont, 30.12.1924.

ROLLAND, Romain (1886–1944): Fifty-five letters to Heinz Häberlin as well as documents related to that correspondence.

SPITTELER, Carl (1845–1924): Two convolutes (of 18 and seven MS pages, respectively) concerning the *Prometheus und Epimetheus* of 1880. Amendments to the earlier version can be ascribed to the suggestions of Prof. Dr. Käslin.

STEIGER, Bruno (*1946): Manuscripts, handwritten workbooks with a collage of materials, typescripts of his published and unpublished works, book projects and joint projects with artists, as well as correspondence, specimen copies, audiovisual documents and photo-portraits.

WALSER, Robert (1878–1956): Microgrammes (paper in a wide variety of qualities and sizes on which Walser drafted his texts in a tiny hand in pencil), unpublished prose manuscripts from the years 1924–1933 and manuscripts of poetry (save for “Der Sonntag” also unpublished), offprints of prose and poetry from his time in Bern. Manuscripts of the novels *Geschwister Tanner* and *Der Gehülfe* as well as other manuscripts and first editions. (On deposit for the Robert Walser Foundation, Bern)

WENGER, Rosalia (1906–1989): The manuscripts and typescripts of her prose works, a few bundles of letters and some personal documents, including diaries, as well as a collection of printed texts and reviews. (Donation of her daughters Nell Arn and Liliane Zwygart)

ZÜRCHER, Zeno (1936–2008): Mainly archives of the Tägeli-Leist and “Junkere 37” assemblies, including tape recordings of many discussions and evening events.




