
POSTCARDS: Numerous donations from the early days of the medium. Of particular note is an early receipt from 1877.

SWISS HERITAGE SOCIETY: The Swiss Heritage Society archive chiefly consists of photographic materials focusing on architectural heritage. It also includes landscape photographs, tourist attractions, some images of traditional costumes, portraits of individuals, photographic documentation concerning the award of the Wakker Prizes and the sale of talers. The photographs were taken between the 1940s and the 1970s, the majority of them in the 1960s. The copyright of many of the documents is unknown. The following names are documented in connection with the older photographs: Keystone, J. Thévoz, Th. and H. Seeger-Müller, Benedikt Rast, Hans Lavater. (gift)

STAUFFER, Serge (1929–1989) and Doris (*1934): The Serge and Doris Stauffer archive contains extensive correspondence, artistic works by Serge Stauffer with handmade artists' books, drawings, collages, photographs and portraits, but also manuscripts, the library of his works in translation, and documentation of his teaching activities at the F+F School of Art and Media Design. The archive records of his partner Doris Stauffer, a central figure in the women's movement of the 1970s in Zurich, illustrate not just the exchange between partners but also the contemporary spirit of social change. BRIAND, Denis, *Stop the Bombs*, 2010. Artist's book examining elements of urban terrorism in graphically reduced form. (gift)

GÜNZBURGER, Michael, *Bräunbär*, 2013. Complement to the prints with animal skins that grow ever larger over time.

GNEHM, Matthias, *Eternal Portrait Gallery, Daniel Schmid*, 2012. Small-format original portrait, graphite and pastel chalk on acid-free painting card, *Eternal Portrait Gallery – Denn die Ewigkeit ist nie nur digital™*. (gift)

HÄNSLI, Christoph, untitled ("Wurstmappe"), 2006–08. Series celebrating the diversity of the sausage, in oil on paper.

JAKOB, Bruno, *Kunst in der Krypta*. Artist's book accompanying the exhibition *Bruno Jakob – The Touch (Forbidden Pictures)* in the crypt of Zurich's Grossmünster. (gift)

LORY, Gabriel [fils], 4 pen drawings. Preliminary studies for prints that may never have been produced. The precise categorisation is still being established.

SALA, Mario, *All about Varanasi*, 2011. Mixed media series by the artist from his Pro Helvetia residence in Varanasi.

SCHIBIG, Marco, *Mystic Transportation, 62 Photographien*, 1983–2006. A photographic observation of architecture over two decades. (gift)

Swiss Literary Archives

AMAN-VOLKART, Elisabeth (1888–1966): Collection of letters written by Elisabeth Aman to Dr. Wolfhart Klee between 1951 and 1965. Of particular interest are the reminiscences of Rilke, e.g. the nostalgic visit to Muzot that Elisabeth Aman-Volkart made in 1956 together with her elder sister Nanny Wunderly-Volkart, Rilke's confidante and patron. (gift)

CANDINAS, Theo (*1929): The archive documents the multifarious activities of a writer as author of poetry, prose and drama, and as a journalist, editor and translator. Candinas has also been an enthusiastic advocate of Romansh culture over many decades, as a board member of the Uniun da scripturas e scripturs rumantschs and the Swiss Writers' Association.

COMMENT, Bernard (*1960): The fonds comprises all the manuscripts of the author's works, articles and critical writings; the film scripts from his collaborations with Alain Tanner; the typescripts of his translations from the Italian, in particular of Antonio Tabucchi; documentation linked to his studies and essays as well as his "Barthes"; and around fifty notebooks, diaries, and manuscripts from third parties.

GÜNTERT, Georges J. (*1938): Collection of letters from Swiss, Italian, Spanish and Portuguese writers and scholars, including Remo Fasani, Giorgio and Giovanni Orelli, Anna Felder, Federico Hindermann and Silja Walter; Mario Luzi, Gesualdo Bufalino, Antonio Tabucchi, Luciano Anceschi, Geno Pampaloni and Cesare Segre. HINDERMANN, Federico (1921–

2012): The literary estate of Federico Hindermann reflects the author's multifaceted character and covers the entire range of his writings. In addition to notes, manuscripts and galley proofs of poems and aphorisms, it also includes articles, translations and documentation on his work, as well as a collection of essays and reviews of numerous authors, together with drawings, photographs and a small number of personal items such as pipes – and his typewriter. (gift of the heirs)

ILG, Paul (1875–1957): Complete literary estate, insofar as it exists, with drafts and typescripts of the works, chiefly from the second creative period of an author who was one of the leading exponents of the now-forgotten Swiss modernism. The estate also contains extensive correspondence, biographical documents with photographs, and press documents. (gift from the heirs)

MORELL, Max (1916–1994): Small literary estate of the detective story and sensationalist fiction writer who was chiefly successful in the 1940s and 1950s, including draft manuscripts.

OPPENHEIM, Meret (1913–1985): Folder of photos of the Oppenheim family, images of houses and studios, as well as a few photos of exhibitions. (on deposit)

ROULET, Daniel de (*1944): The fonds comprises all the manuscripts of the author's works, articles and critical writings; 61 large notebooks constituting the laboratory of his oeuvre (with rough drafts, plans, travel diaries, draft correspondence, lists of titles, etc.); around twenty files of correspondence; personal documents relating to the author's various professions and his studies; and a collection of diaries and small pocket notebooks as well as audio and video material.
