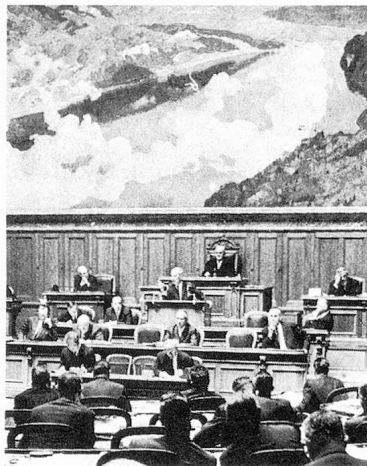

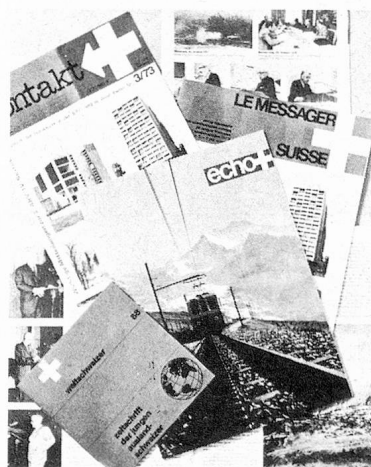

Summer Holidays 1975 Pro Juventute News

Dear Swiss families abroad,
Our holiday campaign will again be at the disposal of your children, although the enormous increase in the cost of living has necessitated some restrictions.

Entitled to take part:

Children of Swiss nationality or children of a Swiss mother who has to look after the family alone, who were born 1961–1968 (holders of invitations 1959–1968).

Duration of holiday:

Approximately 5 weeks in July and August, according to holiday dates.

Holiday possibilities:

In Swiss families

for children between 7 and 14 years, whose parents cannot afford to make a contribution or only a token one. For children with invitations 7–17 years.

In children's homes

for children in need of recuperation and for children between 7

and 11 years, whose parents will pay all or most of the cost. Price per day and child: SFr. 17.— to 27.—.

In camps

for children of between 12 and 14 years, who love simple holidays and happy companionship, who like sports and hiking, and whose parents pay all or most of the cost.

Price per day and child: SFr. 17.— to 27.—.

Journey:

In accompanied groups by train.

Application forms:

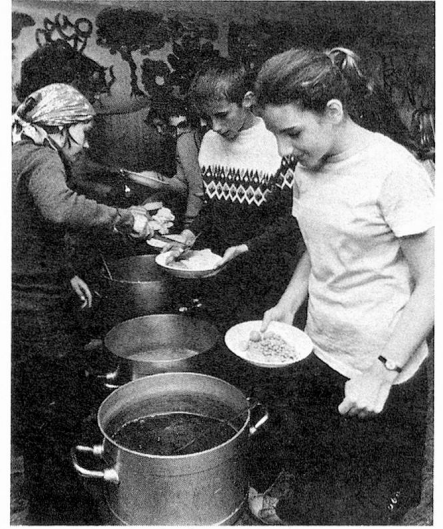
From all Swiss Consulates.

Latest date of application:

At your Consulate: *15th March 1975*. Applications received after that date cannot be considered.

Registration fee:

SFr. 12.— per child, payable on application.
