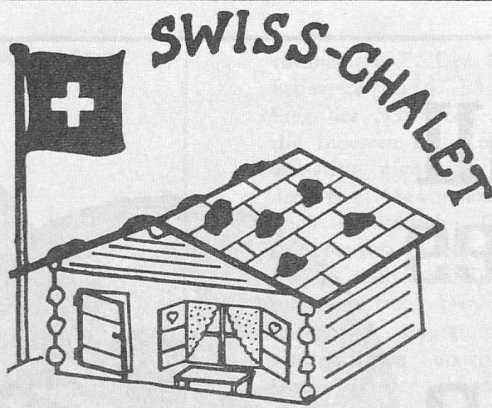

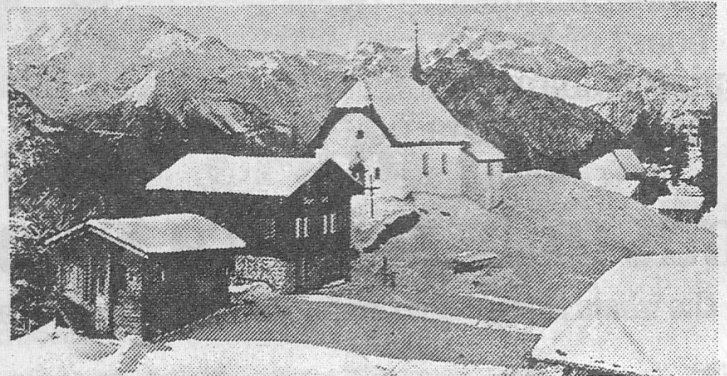

LANDIS & GYR IN IRAQ

Landis & Gyr Co. Ltd (Zug - Switzerland) has just signed a contract with the Iraqi Ministry for the design, construction and fitting up of a state meter factory at Baquba, just under 40 miles from Bagdad. The partial manufacture and assembly of meters for use in homes could start at the end of 1976. The licencing contract includes not only the knowhow and delivery of production plant but also the supply of parts that are not yet produced in Iraq. Until the new factory at Baquba is ready for operation, Landis & Gyr will deliver a large quantity of electric meters to Iraq. (SODT)

PART PLAYED BY VARIOUS SECTORS IN THE SWISS ECONOMY

According to provisional official estimates for 1974, nearly 7.5% of all persons exercising a lucrative activity in Switzerland (employed either full time or part-time converted into full time) were employed in the primary sector (agriculture and forestry). Nearly 47% worked in the secondary sector (industry, building, power), i.e. just under one per cent more than the proportion of persons employed in the tertotalled a little less than 46% of the gainfully employed population. The most recent estimates for 1974 indicate an average increase of about 1% in the personnel employed in the tertiary sector.

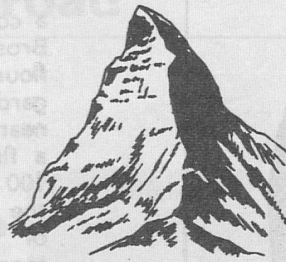

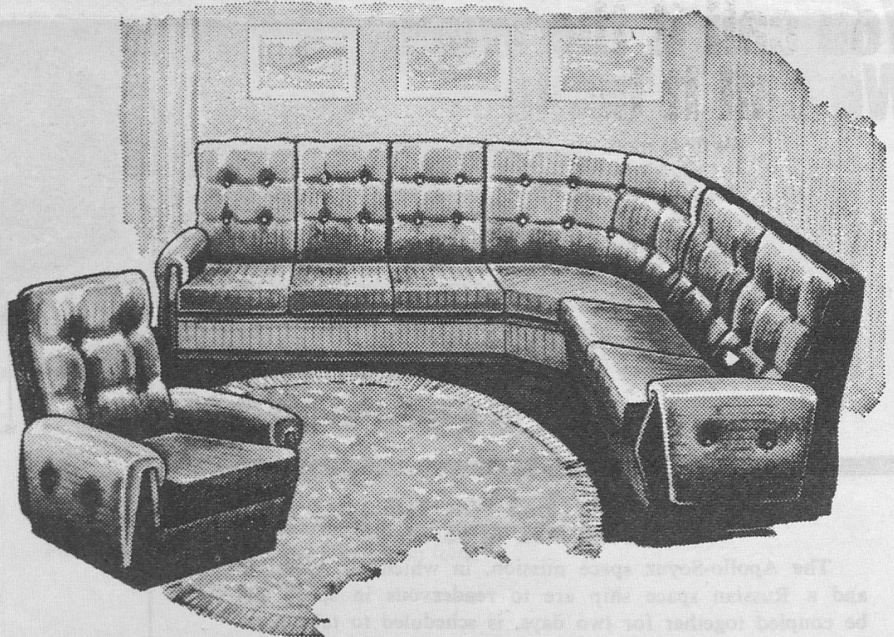

SWISS WATCHES FOR THE APOLLO-SOYUZ MISSION

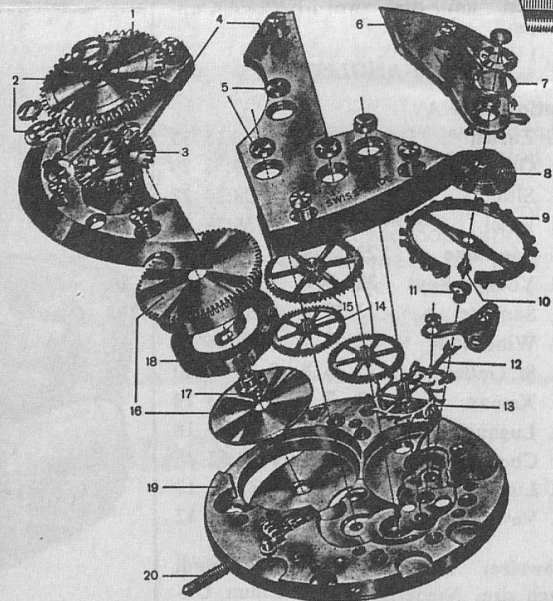
The Apollo-Soyuz space mission, in which an American and a Russian space ship are to rendezvous in space and be coupled together for two days, is scheduled to take place this July. Engineers, scientists, astronauts and cosmonauts of the two countries have been working for over two years to ensure the complete success of this historic rendezvous. In programmes of this kind, it is obviously preferable for certain equipment on board the space ships to be common to both crews. It is, in particular, indispensable for the astronauts to have the same time to the nearest second. Consequently all members of both crews will be wearing high precision Swiss "Omega Speedmaster" watches, which have already proved their worth on several space trips. (SODT)

SWISS FLOUR MILLS FOR ALGERIA

The Algerian National Semolina and Pasta Company (SEMPAC) recently signed a contract with the Swiss firm of Buhler Bros. Co. Ltd (Uzwil - St. Gall) with re-flour mills at Saida and Ouled Mimoun, and to the building of two groups of near Tlemcen. Each of them consists of a flour milling plant with an output of 100 tonnes per day, a semolina plant with the same output and a silo for the storage of wheat with a capacity of 28,000 tonnes. This is the second contract the Swiss firm has signed with SEMPAC, the previous one being in 1969, for the delivery of 5 mills, which have since been put into operation. (SODT)
