NEWS OF THE COLONY NEWS FROM THE EMBASSY

We will most certainly be aware that the Swiss Parliament has continued to impose stringent restriction which consist, among other things, in the curtailment of expenditure in the Federal Administration. This has, much to the regret of the Embassy, also noticeable repercussions on the allocation of personnel for the Swiss diplomatic and consular representations abroad. The fact that the number of Swiss and Dual Nationals in New Zealand registered increased over the last three years, has not spared this Embassy from having its number of staff cut down by one unit.

Teh increasing number of visitors on the other

The increasing number of visitors on the other hand, has forced the Embassy to introduce as from the 1st of March 1981, a new system which consists in regulating the visiting hours as follows:

RECEPTION HOURS

10 a.m. - 1 p.m. Monday - Friday The office hours will remain as before: 8.30 a.m. - 5 p.m. Monday - Thursday 8.30 a.m. - 3 p.m. Friday.

For EMERGENCIES outside office hours, compatriots can get in touch with someone of the Embassy in Wellington by ringing either Nr. 764 764 or 899 385.

The Embassy would like to take this opportunity to remind compatriots to apply for the renewal or ssuance of Swiss passports as early as possible, thus avoiding unforeseen delays in their travel plans. Even if the applicant is registered, it can happen that the Embassy is obliged to clarify certain particulars by approaching the respective authorities in Switzerland.

Compatriots are also advised to notify the

Embassy on the following:

- Change of address or phone number.

- Final departure from the consular district

- Changes of civil status (births, marriage, divorce, deaths etc.).

INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION OF INVENTIONS IN GENEVA

The 9th Exhibition of Inventions and New Technics was held in Geneva from 28th November to 7th December 1980. Over one thousand new inventions were shown by some 500 exhibitors from 28 countries. Once again, protection of the environment, safety and energy saving were the star features, but a great many researchers also presented new inventions in the fields of health, hygiene, articles for the handicapped, sport and leisure.

The first ever participation of the USSR Chamber of Commerce and Industry at this exhibition was a great innovation. France, with nearly 150 exhibitors, was once again the country with the largest number of representatives, while countries like Australia, and the Reupublic of Korea had doubled their stand area. Official organisations like the World Intellectual Property Organisation (WIPO), the European Patents Office, the Swiss Federal Office for Intellectual Property and the French National Institute for Industrial Property, each had information stands or

showed inventions selected by them on a national or a regional basis.

Among the Swiss inventions attracting our attention were a system for removing the ice from motorways and airport runways, a revolutionary bicycle without spokes or driving chain, a window pane providing insulation against the cold and noise, which saves up to 25% of fuel, and can be fitted on old windows without the need for transformations.

The Grand Prix of the Inventions Exhibition was awarded to a Frenchman who had invented an automatic chain for the continuous cutting up and evisceration of pigs, without any manual intervention. Fifteen other prizes were awarded at a ceremony attended by many leading personalities. (SODT).
