At the Half Yearly General Meeting in 1980 the Committee reported that the

The Club is growing with over 750 members and has a turnover in the vicinity of \$200,000. The Committee believes that an enthusiastic team can greatly increase the turnover to their own financial gain with subsequent benefit to the members. 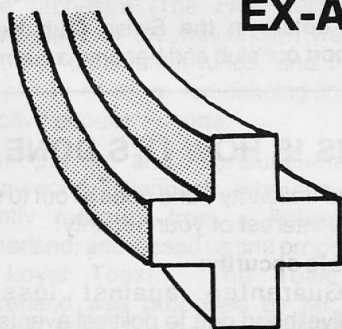

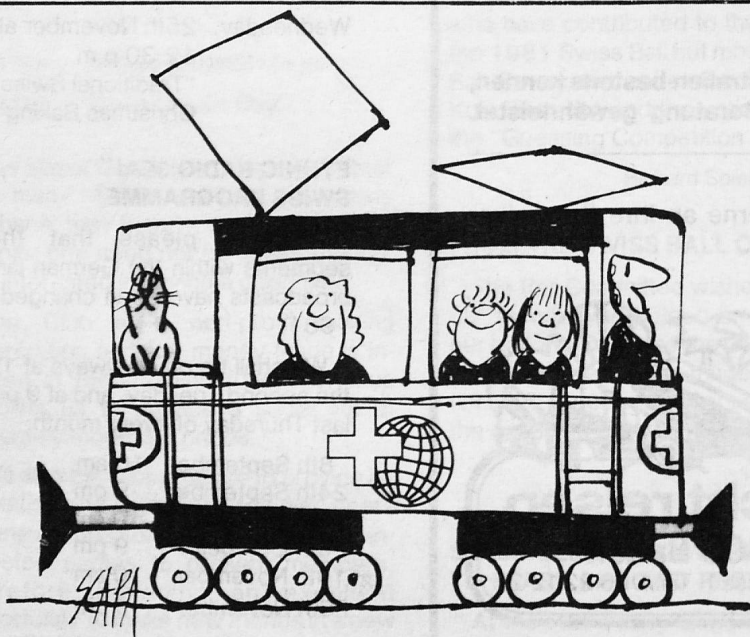

In Zürich geboren, widmete sich
Hans A. Traber nach der Matura
(1940) während sieben Semestern
dem Studium der Medizin und
Biologie an der Universität Zürich.

Durch die Biologie an das vielfältige
Leben und seine mannigfachen
Erscheinungsformen in der Natur
herangeführt, wandte er sich 1944
endgültig vom Hochschulstudium ab
und wurde Mitglied der Redaktion
des "Du", das er als Bildredaktor in
freier Mitarbeit bis 1946
massgeblich mitgestaltete. Bereits
1936 — noch während der Gym-
nasialzeit — war ihm seine erste
biologische Photoaufnahme
gelingen, worauf er sich nebenbei
mit grossem Interesse der
technischen Probleme der Natur-
photographie annahm.

1947 wurde Hans A. Traber mit
der Leitung der biologischen
Abteilung der Schweizer Kulturfilm
AG beauftragt, und ein Jahr später
erfolgte seine Berufung als
Abteilungsleiter für Mikroskopie in
die Wild Heerbrugg AG, die in ihm,
als praktisch erfahrenem
Spezialisten, einen Mann mit
ausserordentlichen Fähigkeiten in
der praxisbezogenen Mikroskopie
gefunden hatte. Seit 1955 steht er
im Dienste verschiedener
naturwissenschaftlich-technischer

Institutionen und ist freier
Mitarbeiter des Schweizer Fern-
sehens.
