The new Consul General, Henning Rieder, and his wife arrived in Melbourne on Friday, 19th August 1983. He joined the Swiss foreign service in 1946. With the exception of two short periods at the home office in Bern, he was stationed in Copenhagen, Munich, New York, Johannesburg, Islamabad and Addis Abeba. The last 4 years before coming to Australia he was assigned to Tripoli, Libya, as Swiss Chargé d'affaires.

Consul Fred Mertz will retire at the end of October and leave for Switzerland where he will take up residence in Basel. During the 37 years in the service of the Department of Foreign Affairs he was posted in Paris, Tel Aviv, Johannesburg, Salisbury, Washington DC, Chicago, Winnipeg, Toronto, Stuttgart and Melbourne.

Mr. Mertz will be replaced by Mr. Werner Ballmer who will join this post, accompanied by his wife, around the middle of November.

TARDENT FAMILY HISTORY

In February 1983 a remarkable book appeared in a limited edition of 314 copies: *The Swiss Australian Tardent Family History and Genealogy*, by Jules L. Tardent, Gold Coast City, 1982. This illustrated publication of some 550 pages gives a fascinating and detailed account of the most outstanding Swiss family to settle in Queensland. During his long retirement Mr. Jules Tardent researched and composed this rich and complex family history. It is more than just an account of a colourful and prominent family of French-Swiss origin, as it also throws light on many aspects of Australian social history. Regrettably it appeared posthumously, as the author had died on November 11th, 1982. The main object in undertaking this book was "to record in English most of the developments of our family since 1398 A.D. We know that from at least this date and probably from before 1231 A.D., our forebears were established in the Ormonts Valley, that is cradled by the Alps of Vaud Canton in Switzerland. The hope is that this record will arouse the interest, even the pride of the family members who read it in Switzerland, in Australia and wherever else they are. An additional hope is that some younger members of the clan may be inspired to continue with the recording of future data". Although Swiss immigrants have arrived in Australia in large numbers since the 1850s — there are now more than 10,000 Swiss here — very little

historical research has been conducted. Even before Australia was settled, there was a Swiss contribution, as John Webber accompanied James Cook as his artist-scientist. In 1975 the then Prime Minister, the Hon. E. G. Whitlam, wrote a foreword for the yet incomplete *Tardent Family History*:

"The Australian nation is composed of many elements apart from the British. Although small in numbers, the Swiss have been excellent immigrants. One Swiss who became a good Australian while still retaining a strong love of his mother-country was Henry Alexis Tardent who established a family in Queensland in 1887 of which 300 descendants still survive. Many of them have achieved distinction in various fields.

"Before he came to Australia Henry Tardent wrote the first history of the Tardents, who are scattered over the world. This volume contains most of his family historical works and much that has been added by younger members in more recent years.

"From the time of his arrival in Australia until his death in 1929, Henry Tardent was intensely active in politics, agriculture and literary activities. He acted as an adviser in the early 1890s to the drafters of the Constitution. In 1898 he became a friend and supporter of Andrew Fisher, the first Labor Prime Minister of Australia. Around 1911 he helped the Government prepare the Act to establish a Citizen Defence Force. A street in Canberra was named after him in recognition of his work

"This volume has been edited, and some of it written, by Tardent's only remaining son, Jules L. Tardent, of Queensland. It should prove to be a useful demonstration of the values of cooperation, enterprise and hard work, and a reminder of one of Australia's most remarkable pioneer families."

Mr. Jules Tardent was always a great admirer of the Swiss and Switzerland and for many years he was an active member of the Swiss Society of Queensland. He spoke French with barely a trace of an accent, although he regretted not having spent more time in the country of his ancestors. With energy and tenacity he worked on a project many thought could not be achieved. It is hoped that this family history will encourage other Swiss in Australia to study their families and their participation in Australian life.

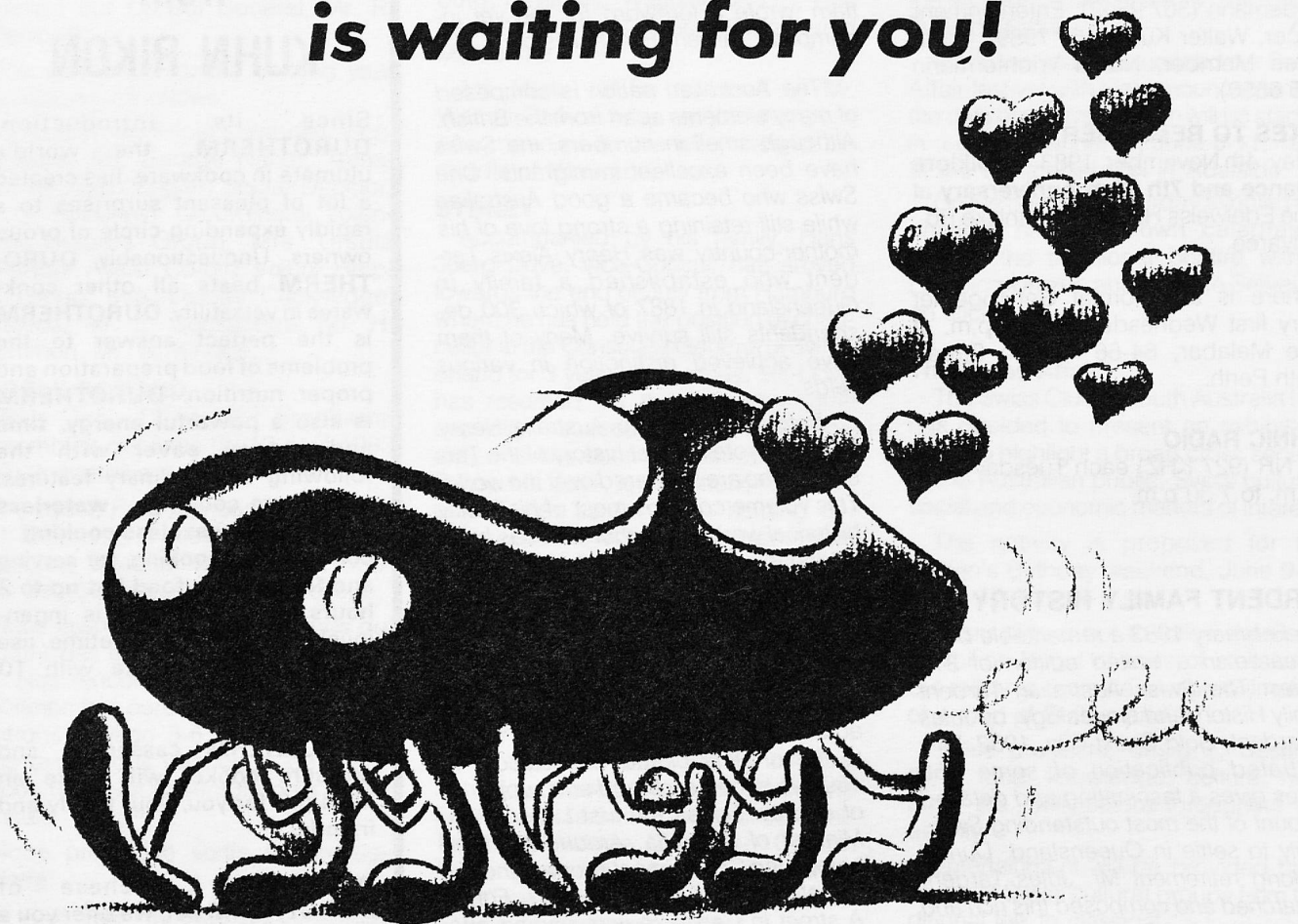
