**PRESIDENT'S REPORT
ON THE MELBOURNE
"OKTOBERFEST"
HELD AT THE ROYAL MELBOURNE
SHOWGROUNDS
28th, 29th and 30th OCTOBER,
1983**

To begin with, I would like to emphasize that the "Melbourne Oktoberfest" is a festival which is organized by "The Melbourne Oktoberfest and Exhibition Society Incorporated", founded by The Austrian Club Melbourne, Club Tivoli German Club, the R.K.V., Treue Husaren and the Swiss Club of Victoria. This Fest is in no way connected with any other Oktoberfest; it has nothing whatsoever to do with the Dandenong Oktoberfest, in which the Swiss Club of Victoria has never participated, nor do we intend to ever participate.

Our Club effectively joined the Society on Wednesday, 3rd August, 1983 after participation was approved by the Swiss Club members during an Extraordinary Meeting held on Wednesday, 27th July, 1983. It is apparent that we did not even have three months to gear ourselves for this grand event. The Swiss Club is represented in the Society by Committee Members Ernst Hugli, Paul Kerrs and Roman Sigel.

By joining the Society, we met a major representation of the German-speaking community of Melbourne. Indeed we made lots of new friends and achieved a basically harmonious understanding between the four clubs.

Each Club was responsible for its own hall, the Swiss Club having been allocated "Cattle Pavilion No. 2". This is of course a pure coincidence and only "Böse Zungen" would relate this to our standing in certain societies as "Kuh Schweizer".

In a way, we are all glad this year's Fest is over, although it will always remain as a pleasant memory in the minds of people who have participated. It generated so much good will and brought the Swiss community and their friends from all over Melbourne closer together. We can certainly look forward to a bigger and even better 1984 Oktoberfest.

Swiss Youth Camp




