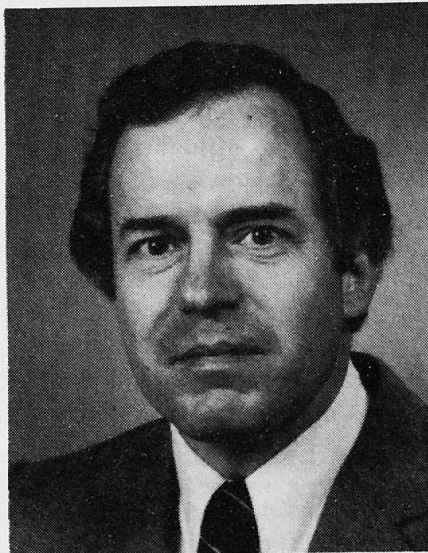


The new President

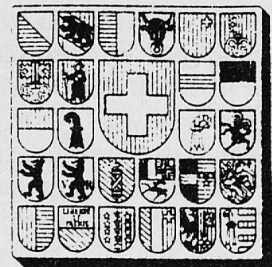

We wish Mrs. Mariann Meier a very happy retirement and would like to say a big thank you for all the hard work and time she has devoted as President of the Nouvelle Soci t  Helv tique during the past 15 years.

Mrs. Meier has lived in London for 50 years. She arrived here as the young wife of a man who was already much involved in the Swiss community. Mr. Meier was President of the S.M.S. for 11 years, and was a founder member of the Federation together with Dr. H. Egli and Mr. Raoul de Cintra in June 1949 (another jubilee this year). Sadly Mr. Meier died in 1961.



Mrs. Meier soon became actively involved in various Swiss Societies. She is a past President of the Swiss Welfare Office. From 1962-69 she was Editor of the *Swiss Observer*. In 1969 Mrs. Meier was elected the first woman President of the Nouvelle Soci t  Helv tique and held this office until March 1984. In 1962 she also became a member of the Ausland-Schweizerkommission, A.S.K., being the first woman member and remaining the only one for many years. After 22 years she is retiring from the A.S.K. at this year's Assembly of the Swiss Abroad held in Basel during May.

Many thanks to Mrs. Meier for her unceasing hard work.

As President of the N.S.H. she has devoted so much of her time and energy to ensuring a programme full of interest month after month for so many years. Lectures have ranged from Swiss Politics, Economy, Banking, Freedom of the Media, The Importance of Swiss Women in History, from Energy to Swissair, Swiss Army, Red Cross, etc. The list is endless. Cultural events have included Summer Concerts at Fenton House, Recitals at the Swiss Church, Waldmann Youth Choir,

Orchester Schule of the Zurich Chamber Orchestra, the Lucerne Singers, Valais Chante and others.

The work of the N.S.H. includes informing members and friends on all topics Swiss, acting as a forum for the discussion of Swiss problems, especially those affecting compatriots abroad, co-operating with other Swiss organisations in the U.K. and the Embassy, with the aim of fostering friendly relations between Great Britain and Switzerland.

Mrs. Meier has certainly succeeded in all these fields, so much so that the London Group of the N.S.H. has firmly established its *raison d' tre*. The retiring President may be justly proud on achieving such singular success. The N.S.H. is the only Society with such a wide field of interest and a growing membership open to all.

At the A.G.M. in February, Mrs. Meier was made an Hon. Vice President in the presence of His Excellency, the Ambassador Mr. Pictet and Mme. Pictet.

As if this was not enough, she still found time amongst all her other activities to become the author of *Young Traveller in Switzerland* which has been translated into several languages. We wish Mrs. Meier a happy retirement with her family.

Activities of the S.R.A.—London

The S.R.A. in London was founded in 1923 and as the name suggests, provides its members with the opportunity of target shooting.

We meet regularly at the Rifle Ranges at Bisley Camp in Surrey, currently eight times per annum, where the 300m practices, shooting with both Karabiner and Sturmgewehr, take place. The targets used are the standard Swiss Army A + B targets.

Members, including Ladies, compete for the Club Trophies as well as the St. Gallen, Zuerich & Einzelwettschiessen Medals.

The Military programme forms an important part of the season's activity. Matches are also held each year with a number of English Clubs, such as the Surrey Rifle Association and the Marylebone Rifle & Pistol Club.

The Bisley meetings are also great family occasions and the lunchtime barbecues at the Club House are well known to the shooting fraternity.

Through the good offices of the EMD in Berne, pistols are also available for shooting on the 50m range at Bisley for the same medal competitions as the rifle competitions. In addition, we also have indoor pistol shooting meetings, currently four times per annum. These are held on the 25m range at the elite Marylebone Pistol Club in the City of London.

The Association concludes the season in appropriate style, with a Dinner/Dance and Prizegiving, usually held in November at a suitable venue in London.

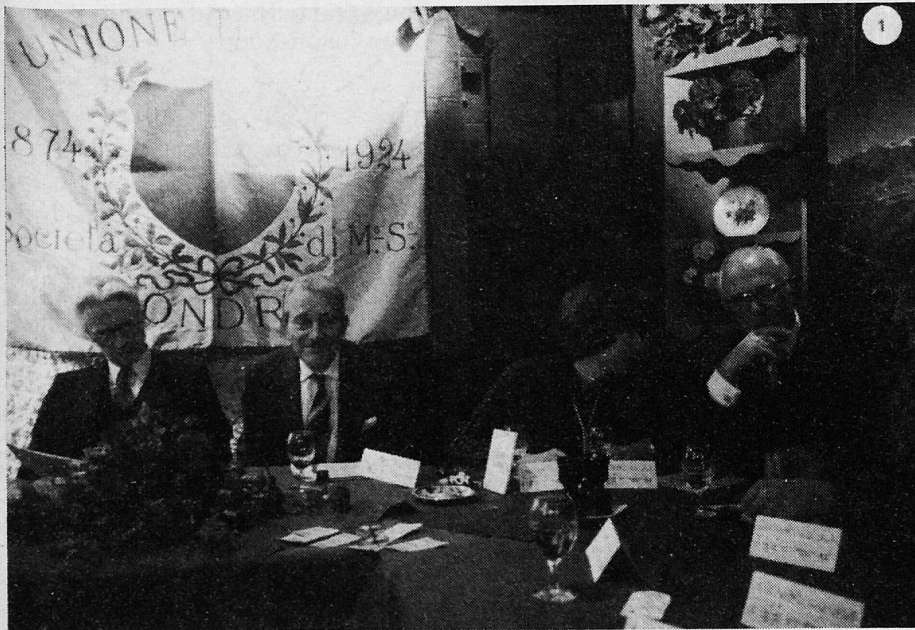

Unione Ticinese celebrates its 110th Anniversary

A social evening to celebrate the 110th Anniversary of Unione Ticinese, founded in London on 8th February, 1874, was held at the Swiss Centre Restaurant in London on Friday, 3rd February, 1984. The new Swiss Ambassador, Monsieur F. C. Pictet and Madame Pictet were guests of honour; Mr. Ernst Tangemann, Vice President of the Federation of Swiss Societies in the UK, and Mrs. Tangemann were also guests. The excellent buffet dinner was attended by some 110 members, their families and friends. Among those present were Mr. and Mme. C. Duboulet, Mr. and Mme. Rossier and Mrs. Mariann Meier.

After dinner the President, Mr. Luigi Bozzini, welcomed the guests and thanked the Ambassador for accepting to become the Hon. President of the Society. He conveyed the apologies of various personalities from Ticino who were unable to attend and read out a message of greeting and good wishes from the Swiss Ambassador to the USSR and Mme. Fritschi. He also took the opportunity to wish Mr. Rossier success in his new post, and both him and Mme. Rossier a pleasant stay in Morocco. Mr. Bozzini then went on to thank the Society's Sub-Committee for organising the evening, before proposing a toast to the Society.

The Vice President, Mr. Giuseppe Broggin, speaking in Italian, then gave a brief outline of the historical background of the past 110 years and stressed the importance of attracting new members of the younger generation and also of co-operating more fully with the other Swiss Societies. The Ambassador thanked the Society for asking him to become Hon. President and for inviting him and Mme. Pictet to the celebration: it was his first public engagement since taking up his post a week earlier. A young couple of accordionists, who had been flown in from Ticino for the occasion, entertained the guests before and after the dinner, when many of those present joined in the singing of Ticinesi folksongs. The evening was a great success, much enjoyed by everyone present.
