### **Calgary, Alberta Alberta-Swiss Crossbow Association**

On July 21, 1984, the Alberta-Swiss Crossbow Association celebrated the official opening of the new Crossbow facility, combined with the «Standartenweihe».

The Alberta-Swiss Crossbow Association was formally incorporated on February 10, 1984, under the laws of Alberta. As a joint project with the Alberta Provincial Rifle Association, who financed the material cost for the building, the crossbow facility was constructed over the last 14 months. Many hundreds of hours of donated labour where sacri-

ficed by a handfull of dedicated crossbowshooters to make this facility, the first of its kind in Alberta, possible.

The colourparty was led by the Vancouver Standarte and three members of the Vancouver crossbow club, followed by the 38 members of the Kings Own Calgary Rifle military band. Behind them came a delegation of 12, dressed in middle age Swiss costumes complete with Hellebarde as honour guard for the new Calgary standarte. Mr. Paul Betschard, Vice President of the «Schweizerische Armbrust-Schützen-Verband» made a presentation to Michael Meier, the

president of the Alberta Swiss Crossbow Association. Mr. Gil Hirst, President of Sports Alberta and Mr. Gordon Shrake, Member of the Alberta Legislature addressed the crowd on hand and welcomed the visitors from Switzerland. Mr. Hans Schalch presented the new standarte as a Gift to the Alberta Swiss Crossbow Association, it was greatfully accepted by its president, Michael Meier. In accepting it, Mr. Meier stated it was a sign of what co-operation between people can do and expressed the hope that it would be a sign of unity amongst the Swiss shooters in Calgary. In total 57 shooters took part in the opening match, 19 Visitors

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
