### THIS AND THAT

- 1985, 788 young men refused to serve their time in the army, 43 more than the year before.
- Forests in the canton of Wallis are less damaged than a study proved, said Regierungsrat Bornet. But the situation in the forests clearly deteriorated during the last 12 months.
- The number of doctors in Switzerland is rising. 18,315 doctors are members of the "doctors union", 770 more than the previous years, which means there is one doctor per 360 citizens.
- The biggest wind powerstation in Europe started production on a test base in the canton of Jura, in Fahy, the 30m high machine produces 160 kWh, enough for about 50 households. The wheel measures about 17m in diameter.
- The Bundesgericht refused the making of a golf-course in Zurzach since it would involve a big acreage of prime farmland.
- In 1984, farmers in Switzerland produced 550,000 tonnes of wheat, 350,000 tonnes being used for flour production. The rest will be used as stockfood.
- In 1986, the city of Zuerich will celebrate its 2000th birthday. All citizens are asked to start thinking about ways and means to celebrate the big occasion.
- The citizens of Solothurn seen to have problems with the speed limit of 50kmh. More than 10% of the drivers got caught driving too fast.
- In January, 1985, inflation rose by 1% to 3.5%, the reason being the high use of heating fuel.

At midnight, everybody joined in singing and greeting each other with best wishes for the happy New Year.


A lovely supper was then served by members of the committee. Festivities went on to the early hours of the morning, all agreeing it was a terrific evening which everyone had enjoyed.


