### Swiss Citizenship for children of Swiss mothers and foreign fathers

The procedure of how to apply for Swiss citizenship for such children born after 31st December, 1952 and before 1st July, 1985 was outlined in the last SWISS REVIEW (No. 2/85, pages 9 and

Children, whose births have already been registered with the Consulate General at an earlier date, will not automatically acquire Swiss citizenship under the new law which came into force on 1st July, 1985.

An application for recognition as a Swiss national will have to be filed for all children (whether already registered with the Consulate General or not) by not later than 30th June, 1988. Without such an application, no child will become a Swiss citizen.


### SWISS CLUB OF VICTORIA

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Due to lack of space, we have so far never been in a position to report on the major SWISS AFFAIR organized by the Swiss Club of South Australia and held on Queen's Birthday Weekend 1984. We are happy to be able to do so at last, as this issue, like the previous one, once again contains nine local pages.

### **SWISS AFFAIR REPORT**

The Swiss Affair was held as planned on Saturday 9th June and Sunday 10th June at Centennial Hall in Adelaide. At the risk of appearing boastful, it is suggested that the Swiss Club of S.A. can be justly proud of having staged an exhibition of such quality and wide appeal as was evidenced by the comments of visitors, who praised the contents of the Swiss Affair.

A total of 14 exhibitors took part, these were Elna with sewing machines, Victorinox with the army knives, Swiss Glory and its famous chocolates, J.R. Furniture with hand crafted leather furniture by a local Swiss craftsman, Nestle's Food Delicacies and Socomin with imported food specialties, World Travel Headquarters representing Danzas, Swissair, Mik International with Pfeil woodcarving tools, Eurovin with imported French and German wines, Zurich Life Insurance, Nick Zuercher a local Swiss orchid grower, and It's a Gas balloons and clowns, and also Wendy's Super Sundaes. Locally hand made arts and crafts, as well as imported souvenirs were available, and Lindt and Spruengli chocolates from Switzerland were very much in favour with visitors. Special features were the Red Cross, the St. Bernard Dogs Club, an artificial Ski Slope, Crossbow Shooters re-enacting the legend of William Tell, and the Sherlock Holmes Society, playreading the final demise of the famous detective at the hands of Professor Moriarty at the Reichenbach Falls. A collection of contemporary prize winning Swiss Commercial Posters were displayed, and photographic reproduction of nearly 40 paintings by Louis Buvelot, a Swiss painter who lived in Melbourne in the latter part of last century, achieving fame in Australia and becoming known as the bush artist, were exhibited. The Pestalozzi Village, which provides a home for many orphans and destitute children from all over the world was a special feature. A cinema screened Swiss Travel and documentary films on a continuous basis, and at least 2,000 visitors would have spent some time watching these. Typical Swiss dishes were served, and

seated at red and white tables under a giant 20 m. x 20 m. Swiss Flag strung across the ceiling, the visitors could enjoy the folkloric entertainment on stage at regular intervals. The Edelwyss Yodelers from Melbourne and the Kiwi Yodelers from Auckland (N.Z.) delighted everyone with yodeling, alphorn blowing, flag throwing and playing various traditional Swiss musical instruments.


As the Swiss Affair aimed at informing the people of Adelaide about all aspects of Switzerland, special exhibits gave written and pictorial information about such diverse topics as Swiss history, government, railway systems, Merchant Navy, Vatican Guards, famous personalities, currency, etc., etc., The Swiss Government was officially represented with an information stand at which the Vice Consul from Melbourne Mr. Ballmer, together with Mrs. Ballmer were kept extremely busy with continuous enquiries in respect of trade, tourism, culture and other topics about Switzerland.

The major Swiss Cities and Resorts were prominently featured, namely Basel, Bern, Geneva, Interlaken, Lausanne, Lugano, Luzern, St. Moritz, Zermatt, and Zurich, and visitors to the Swiss Affair received a "passport" which was duly "custom stamped" upon entering the exhibition hall symbolising arrival into "Switzerland". In addition, further stamping of the passports at each of the 10 Swiss Cities was available. Centennial Hall was decorated in a red and white theme (the Swiss National Colours), with pinetrees scattered throughout, banners hanging from the ceiling and depicting stylised landmarks of the 10 featured cities, and tops above the exhibitors' stalls represented stylised chalet roofs. The entrance to the hall was transformed into a border post with sentry boxes and custom barriers. The design was conceived by students from the School of Design of the S.A. College of Advanced Education.

The whole concept of the exhibition representing a "mini-Switzerland" was devised by Russell Starke of the Starke Stable, whose company also handled the promotional side of the Swiss Affair. Prominent Adelaide Department Store David Jones promoted Switzerland during the week prior to the Swiss Affair with various displays inside the store as well as shop window displays with Swiss products. Numerous radio and T.V. interviews took place in the week preceding the event and paid advertisements appeared in the Adelaide Press in key positions in the week leading up to the Swiss affair, thus ensuring most adequate publicity for it. On the Thursday before, the Swiss Affair was officially launched during a ceremony in the garden court behind the Constitutional Museum in Adelaide, when the Lord Mayor of Adelaide Mrs. Wendy Chapman unfurled a Swiss Flag to mark the event.

The Swiss Affair attracted in excess of 6,000 visitors, which whilst gratifying, was neverthless short of the anticipated 10,000, on which a break-even budget had been based. This leaves the Swiss Club of S.A. with a substantial deficit, which will take a few years to absorb. A number of Swiss Companies were very generous with their financial support, and we are indeed indebted to them for their backing. This was the first Swiss Affair: it was never contemplated as a yearly event. However, should sufficient support be evident, particularly in a financial sense, it is possible that the Swiss Affair could become a recurring event, say every 3 years.

The Organising Committee thanks all the participants, and naturally would welcome any comments relevant to the Swiss Affair, as well as expressions of continuing interest and support in the future.

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


