The **third prize** was won by Martha Lucia Santana from Bogota, Columbia: a silver-plated ballpen and an instructive and amusing game on Switzerland.



Baba Maggi – the doctor of the tropical forest

It all began over 36 years ago ...

Almost a fairy-tale.

Giuseppe Maggi was the son of an engineer who taught him a different handicraft or trade every summer holiday; after a happy childhood in the Ticino and effortless studies in Lausanne and Paris, as well as a few years of practical work in the Canton of Neuchâtel and the Ticino, Maggi suddenly felt the call to go to Africa – as he confessed later, he wanted to see the Kilimandjaro. Thus he has been in Tanganyika since 1948 as doctor and director of a hospital in the service of the Mission of White Brethren. He got to know the black continent and above all its inhabitants, and this became quite a passion. He also had to face all kinds of sicknesses, those from Europe as well as tropical diseases. Quick action became vital. There was only one thing that mattered to him: to keep thousands of



people from a dark and certain death. In 1952, he left Tanganyika and went to the Camerons. There, in the heart of the tropical forest, near Duala, he started work of which nobody ever heard. He built a hospital with his own hands, the first of a long row. In fact, no sooner had he finished one and made it operational, he handed it over to the

local diocese and moved on. Year by year he went on, further north, in stages of 150–200 km, and everywhere he left new hospitals and emergency stations. After St. André it was Omwan in 1956, next Tokombéré in 1959. He might possibly have remained there were it not for a hard blow fate dealt him which later turned out to be a bit of luck for him – a big fire destroyed his work, his house, everything except his glasses!

This dramatic night meant a turning-point in the life of Giuseppe Maggi. The news of the fire spread throughout Europe and also to Switzerland. Several charitable organizations got involved and collected money. Dr. Maggi rebuilt the hospital of Tokombéré, better than before. Since then he has not been alone, his name became known and he knew that help was there for him.
