OBITUARY

The following two items were received just too late for inclusion in our last issue - No. 4/87.

BOURNEMOUTH LOSES LEADING SWISS PERSONALITY

With the recent death of Rudi Müller, Bournemouth's sizeable Swiss community has lost a leading figure and long standing friend and the Bournemouth Twinning Association its principal pioneer.

After a career that varied from working with the famous Lucerne firm of jewellers and watchmakers, Bucherer's, to a London post with Co-op Travel, Rudi, by then an active member of Swiss community life in the metropolis, retired and came with his wife, Julia, to live in Bournemouth. It is perhaps typical of him that he refused to give up his past ties and remained in touch with former colleagues and friends right to the end.

A born organiser and a stout champion of the country of his birth, his instinct was to seek out his fellow-countrymen wherever he was and to bring them together. A natural need to speak his own language impelled him, once in Bournemouth, to set up and run a local Swiss Club and seek to bring everyone into it who had a special connection with Switzerland.

So it was that at the end of the '70s, when Bournemouth's Town Council was toying with the idea of a twinning relationship and a chance remark within earshot of Lucerne's marketing director by as unlikely a person as a Bournemouth promoter of pop concerts led to first contacts between Lucerne and Bournemouth, it was Rudi who was called upon by the Mayor of Bournemouth to provide the necessary liaison. Rudi was the ideal person for the job, for, not only could he enlighten the local Council on all aspects of Lucerne's character and governmental structure, but also as a native of that city and a speaker of both languages he was in a similar position of trust in Lucerne and equally fitted to be of help there.

One wonders, therefore, whether Bournemouth would ever have become Lucerne's "sister town" if Rudi had not been a citizen of both; or indeed whether without him the twinning arrangement would have survived its initial teething troubles. Time will no doubt only serve to confirm the debt both townspeople owe him.

We, of the Bournemouth Twinning Association, shall greatly regret his absence. The liaison work he did has now fallen to me, but though I speak both my own and his native language I fear I shall never live up to the standards he set.
