After a long, serious illness, Ambassador Alfred Glesti passed away on 22nd August, 1988, in Canberra, aged 60.

All who met Ambassador Glesti will remember him as a man of broad humanity, very generous, gentle and loving and compassionate.

# New Swiss Ambassador to Australia

The Federal Council has nominated Dr. rer.pol. Arnold Hugentobler Ambassador of Switzerland in Australia as successor to the late Ambassador Glesti. He arrives in Canberra on 25th November, 1988.

Born in 1930, Ambassador Hugentobler is a citizen of Siegershausen, Canton Thurgau. He studied in St. Gall and Paris and joined the Swiss diplomatic service in 1959. After his probationary practice with the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs in Bern and Berlin, he served in New Delhi, Beijing, Bern, Havanna and Bern. In 1976, he was appointed Ambassador in Irak. In 1980, he returned to Bern where he assumed the position of Deputy Director at the Political Directorate of the Department. In 1984, he was nominated Ambassador in Norway and Iceland with residence in Oslo.

In the name of the Swiss community of Australia, we welcome Ambassador Hugentobler.






