# Swiss Citizenship for Children of Swiss Mothers

Children of Swiss mothers, born between January 1st, 1953, and June 30th, 1985, had the possibility to apply for recognition as Swiss Nationals until June 30th, 1988. During that period thousands of applications were lodged, either in Switzerland or with the relevant Swiss diplomatic and consular representations abroad. In Australia alone, over 900 applications were lodged. This amounts evidently to a drastic increase of the workload at various levels (federal, cantonal, municipal) and this additional work has to be done by the regular staff of the offices concerned. At the same time, their "normal" tasks have also to be fulfilled by the public servants involved. Therefore, a considerable backlog in the processing of the applications for recognition of Swiss citizenship has arisen, and delays of two years and over are no rarity. Interventions by the Consulates are discouraged, as they do not really help to speed up the processing, but rather create additional work. However, this delay should not cause any alarm or distress. In fact, the crucial date was the date of presentation of the application. If this was done not later than on June 30th, 1988, and if the prerequisites prescribed by the new law are fulfilled, the decision will eventually reach the applicant. As the persons directly concerned do not yet receive the Swiss Review, their mothers might care to reassure them accordingly. PE.
