


A new piece of sporting equipment is taking the ski-slopes by storm. The ski-sail not only brings added colour and gracefulness with it, but it also offers the ski-fan a completely new sensation of movement.

During their stay at a ski-camp in Morgins in the spring of this year, some 40 Swiss youngsters living abroad took quite a large step closer to realising Icarus's eternal dream of being able to fly. Ski-ing downhill with wind-filled ski-sails on powder snow under a blue sky comes very close to floating or even flying through the air, as the skier's



body weight is reduced by somewhere between 30 and 50 percent, depending on his/her speed.

Thanks to a skilled display by the Swiss national ski-acrobatic team, the video "Spiel auf Schnee - Farben im Lichtkreis der Sonne" illustrates the delightful variety of this new sport form that is becoming increasingly popular in Switzerland. The films, which obviously represent an even greater attraction for those Swiss living abroad, are available in three languages with a sound track, as well as in 16 mm and 35 mm format. The presentation film, lasting about 20 minutes, shows off the high Alpine region of Switzerland between the Matterhorn and Monte Rosa to its best advantage.
