The following issue, Nr. 3/91, will appear at the end of June and should reach the readers in Australia towards July 10th, 1991.



### Swiss Handicrafts between Yesterday and Tomorrow

An exhibition of the Swiss National Tourist Office will be shown at the Meatmarket Craft Centre in *Melbourne* from July 17th to August 18th, 1991.

In *Sydney*, the two exhibitions on **Federalism** and **Handicrafts** will be hosted by the State Library of New South Wales from September 12th to December 8th.

Independently from the celebrations of 1991, the following musical events are expected:

The "Musique de Landwehr", the Concert and Marching Band and official Music Corps of the State and the City of Fribourg, will participate in the Pacific Basin Music Festival in *Sydney*, from June 29th to July 4th. They will perform at the following concerts:

## On Dual Citizenship

Fairly regularly, Swiss citizens ask what will happen if they acquire the Australian nationality. The answer is simple: they become dual nationals. In fact, Switzerland recognises dual citizenship, i.e. a person remains Swiss even when acquiring the Australian nationality.

However, it may be useful to recall the following rules that apply to *all* dual nationals, whether they have acquired another nationality by birth or by naturalization:

– The nationality of the country of residence is considered predominant. In other words, a person who is also an Australian national will be treated by the Australian authorities like every other citizen of this country and cannot invoke Swiss citizenship in a dispute.

– A woman who also possesses the nationality of her prospective husband must sign a declaration that she wishes to retain her Swiss citizenship. This declaration must be consigned to a Swiss diplomatic or consular representation *before* the marriage. Failure to do so entails the loss of the Swiss nationality.

– A child who is born abroad and has another nationality forfeits the entitlement to Swiss citizenship if the birth is not notified to a Swiss authority (e.g. the Consulate General) before the accomplishment of the 22nd year of age. This rule applies to virtually all children born in Australia of Swiss parents, because the Australian nationality is automatically acquired if the parents hold a permanent residence permit. Of course, the responsibility lies with the parents. It has happened repeatedly that the son or daughter of Swiss parents in the mid-twenties enquired about the possibility to obtain a Swiss passport in view of working in Switzerland, only to find out too late that the parents had neglected to notify the birth.
