Well over 50,000 people visited the Place of the Swiss Abroad in Brunnen this summer, according to Peter Hugentobler, who was in charge of the information pavilion until the end of October. A big attraction was the exhibition "Meet the Fifth Switzerland", organised by the Secretariat for the Swiss Abroad. The Swiss Path round the Lake of Uri was another magnet for many visitors.

One of the highlights of this eventful year was the official opening of the Place of the Swiss Abroad on 4 May 1991 in the presence of Federal Councillor

Jean-Pascal Delamuraz and National Council President Ulrich Bremi. At the end of July attention was focused on the domed roof of the Botta tent, a worthy setting for those attending the Congress of the Swiss Abroad and the reception for the seven members of the Federal Council by the Swiss Abroad on August 1, 1991.

It is to be hoped that next year, too, many Swiss from at home at abroad will make their way to Brunnen. They will find that the freshly-planted Place of the Swiss Abroad is the ideal place to meet one another. *SM*

Youth Exchange 1992

In this programme young Swiss living abroad spend six-week holidays in the homes of Swiss families in Switzerland and vice versa.

Depending on inclination and interest, the young people concerned may attend holiday training courses, participate in one-week trial apprenticeships or settle preliminaries for university studies.

The offer is for young people whose families live in the following countries:

Argentina, Australia, Belgium, Canada, Colombia, Denmark, France, Germany, Holland, Italy,

Norway, South Africa, Spain, Sweden, United Kingdom.

Dates: 4.7./10.8.1992

Conditions: Age 14–20. For overseas applicants 16–20. Mother or father must be a Swiss citizen.

Price: Sfr. 400.–, excluding travel. This includes information camp, individual vocational training periods and trial apprenticeships, evaluation day, supervision.

Registration: By end of March 1992. Application forms are obtainable from local coordinators (see local pages of your Swiss Review) or from the Secretariat for the Swiss Abroad.
