Looking after young people plays an important part in the range of services provided by the Secretariat for the Swiss Abroad. Apart from CSSA (Committee for Swiss Schools Abroad) and AJAS (Association for the Training of Young Swiss Abroad), the youth service exists to look after the interests of Swiss Abroad aged between 15 and 25 all over the world.

The two SSA ski camps promise lots of fun in the snow with young people from all over the world. They take place at Christmas in Splügen/Grisons and at Easter in Grimentz/Valais. Young Swiss Abroad will be introduced to skiing and snowboarding, and beginners will get special attention. Optional programmes (cross-country, snowboard, curling, skating, free half-days, excursions, etc.) provide constant change of scenery.
