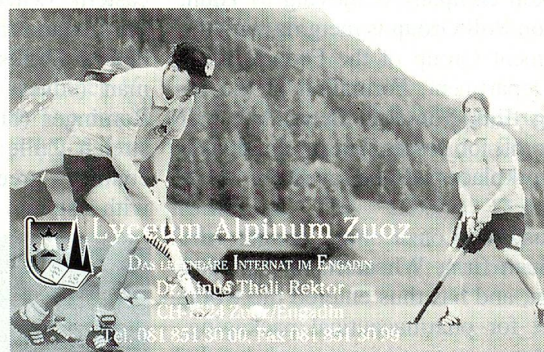

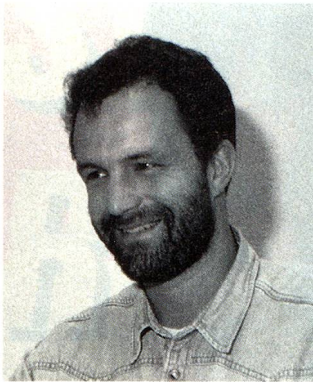

Benito Invernizzi resigns

After 26 years at the head of the Solidarity Fund for the Swiss Abroad, Benito Invernizzi is now taking well-earned retirement. His successor is Elisabeth Nassar-Ory.

After training as a teacher, Benito Invernizzi worked in business before joining the Federal Political Department in 1957, where he quickly reached the rank of head of chancellery. He left in 1970 to become executive head of the Solidarity Fund.

Elections to the Council for the Swiss Abroad

Do take part!

The constitutive instrument which set up the Organisation for the Swiss Abroad is clear about one thing: it is to be run by the Council for the Swiss Abroad, which is its highest body. This is made up to the tune of at least three-fifths by delegates resident outside our frontiers and for at least a quarter by members living in Switzerland. And for each delegate from abroad an alternate may be designated.

The umbrella organisations recognised by the Organisation for the Swiss Abroad for the Swiss associations in any one country or group of countries are authorised to arrange the election of the external delegates. This at least is the way the process is

run in all those countries and regions where most of our compatriots abroad are resident. If there is no umbrella organisation, the delegates and their alternates are selected by mutual agreement amongst the associations concerned.

In this way the system enables all our compatriots abroad who are interested in defending their rights and making a gesture of solidarity between the Swiss Abroad and their countrymen living at home to participate in the election of the Council for the Swiss Abroad through the associations and other groupings. There are more than 700 of these; they are open to all Swiss and have this responsibility wherever they may be. The delegates from within Switzerland are nominated by the Council itself with a view to the role which they can play in favour of the Fifth Switzerland by virtue of their cultural, economic or political influence.

The some one hundred and fifty members of the Council are to be elected for the next four years between now and the spring of 1997, and the first meeting of the new members will be held in August 1997.

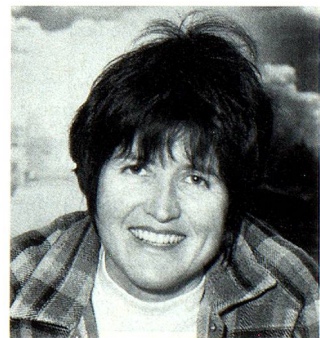
