It started in 1991 as Action Encounter. It has continued as Swiss Ping Pong. In the upcoming year it aims to attract as many young Swiss Abroad as possible. It means staying with a Swiss host family. In 1998 there are two reasons why you will find it particularly worthwhile taking part in «Swiss Ping Pong». First it is a festival year for the Confederation, and second it can be combined with
