The service allows users to receive television and radio programs from the SRG's satellite transmitters. The service is available in Switzerland and other countries in Europe. The service offers a variety of programs, including news, documentaries, entertainment, and educational programs.

The magic words are SRG SSR Sat Access.

As a Swiss citizen living abroad you've had to do without 'your' TV programmes. Well, that's a thing of the past. SRG SSR Sat Access can now deliver Swiss TV channels to your set, no matter what part of Europe you live in.

The Swiss Broadcasting Corporation's entire range of German, French and Italian-language TV programmes will be transmitted (SF1, SF2, TSR1, TSR2, TSI1 and TSI2). An information channel will be transmitted unencrypted. In addition, 6 radio programmes can be received via this channel.

Why does the SRG transmit in encrypted form?

For legal reasons, the SRG is obliged to scramble its TV programmes if they are transmitted outside Switzerland. As a Swiss citizen, however, you can now enjoy the privilege of receiving SRG programmes thanks to our Sat Access Card. In Viaccess we have selected a coding system that is tailored to Switzerland's different language groups.

What is Viaccess?

Europe doesn't have a uniform coding system yet. The SRG has opted for the French Viaccess system, which is proving increasingly popular in Europe. More and more digital satellite receivers are being adapted to the Viaccess standard.

When you buy a DVB (Digital Video Broadcasting) receiver, you must make sure it is equipped for Viaccess. Otherwise you won't be able to use the SRG SSR Sat Access Card.




Sat Access Card – the key to the SRG's TV channels


To receive Swiss TV channels, you need the SRG SSR Sat Access Card and a DVB receiver (set top box) equipped for Viaccess.

As a Swiss citizen resident abroad, you can purchase the card from SRG SSR Sat Access by making a payment of CHF 50, plus CHF 120 a year to help defray cover distribution costs.




To receive signals from the Hotbird 3 satellite, a satellite dish at least 60 cm in diameter, which is equipped for digital broadcasting, plus a universal LNB (Low Noise Bloc, receiver converter), is required. You can see on the card the size of satellite dish you'll need in your region.



What does satellite reception offer?

The SRG broadcasts its programmes via Hotbird 3, one of the Eutelsat group of satellites with an orbital position 13° East above the Equator. Besides Swiss programmes, satellite reception provides you with a comprehensive range of international TV channels to choose from, with new ones being added almost daily.
