

# READERS' TRIP



In 1998 a group of Swiss Abroad made a trip to Central Switzerland and the Canton Ticino. The participants discovered an unknown Switzerland with a fascinating history. This year we are offering "Swiss Review" readers a historical trip along the Rhone, through French-speaking Switzerland.

ur journey begins in Switzerland's birthplace. From Lucerne we will take a trip up the Titlis (3030 m), the highest mountain in Central Switzerland. After enjoying an unforgettable panorama we will visit several museums, the Rütli and other landmarks in Swiss history.

Following two nights in Brunnen, we travel over the Furka Pass to Brig. Although the Canton of Valais is bilingual, French is the predominant language. Over the centuries the valley's mountainous surrounds and barren landscape have forced generations of Valais residents to seek their livelihood by emigrating. Often they found new professions as soldiers or as pioneers in the international hotel industry. In the Valais itself, however, tourism has also developed well - in places such as Zermatt.

Continuing along the Rhone we will reach Lake Geneva, where one of the most beautiful wine-growing regions of Switzerland awaits us. Towering, sprawling slopes covered with green vineyards are reflected in the clear waters of the lake. On the opposite shore lies France.

From Lausanne, capital of this region, we take a little side-trip to the Jura. It is here, in the sleepy alpine Vallée de Joux, that the smallest, most sophisticated and most beautiful watches in the world have traditionally been made. This is the cradle of the watch industry.

Finally we return to the Rhone. Geneva, the second-largest city in Switzerland with a population of 400,000, is an open city. Since the Reformation it has been the hub of numerous international activities. For instance, it is the seat of the United Nations and countless other international organisations. Yet Geneva

also holds many attractions for the tourist. The magnificent jeweller's stores on the Rue du Rhône are world-famous.

On a trip to the hinterland of Geneva we will see that Geneva seems practically an enclave of France. Only one road leads to Switzerland, yet Geneva's ties with the Federation are strong.

Every day we will also enjoy a culinary excursion, sampling "Recipes with Swiss History" based on historical and geographical facts. Specialities like raclette from the Valais will be supplemented by wine-tasting trips in the Cantons of Valais, Vaud and Geneva.

Our tour will be accompanied by historians speaking German, French and English. We will travel by coach and stay in 3-star hotels with full board. The first trip will take us from Lucerne to Lausanne from 31 July to 5 August. The return trip starts in Lausanne on 9 August and ends in Lucerne on 14 August. Between these trips the Congress of the Swiss Abroad will be held in Lausanne from 6 to 8 August. Those not wishing to attend the Congress can still register for the famous Fête des Vignerons (see "Swiss Review" 5/98).
