Expo.02 for the young!

Expo.02 offers young Swiss Abroad a unique opportunity to gain a contemporary insight into the country where their parents or grandparents grew up.

Our summer camps are situated in the centre of the exhibition region. Bienne, Murten, Neuchâtel and Yverdon-les-Bains are the venues – so-called “arteplages” – of

Expo.02. A mobile “arteplage” will also be plying the lakes of the Jura region as an innovative mode of transport connecting the various Expo.02 venues.

Our summer camp’s “tepee village” will be set up in Ins, at the heart of the three-lakes region, from where some 120 young Swiss Abroad from age 16 will be able to visit all five Expo sites. At

the same time the 14 to 16-year-olds will be housed in attractive group accommodation above Lake Neuchâtel. Needless to say, a three-day-pass to Expo. 02 is included in the cost of the camp.

Next summer all our arrangements revolve around Expo, and we are endeavouring to find lots of host families near the Expo complex.

300 young people visit the National Exhibition

The Foundation for Young Swiss Abroad has plans to take our holiday campers to Expo.02. To this end it has reserved three houses within easy reach of all the Expo sites.

To allow as many young Swiss Abroad as possible to take advantage of this special offer, we have shortened the duration of our summer camp from 14 to 12 days but increased the number of participants from 250 to 300. During these twelve days we will be making three visits to different exhibition sites (so-called “arteplages”). Naturally the usual holiday programme will be fitted in between these trips. The following camp dates are planned:

Monday 24 June–Friday 5 July: “Dütsch et Welsch” Swiss tour for 25 (sporty) participants aged between 13 and 16.

Sunday 7 July to Saturday 24 August: Nine 12-day camps (Sunday to Wednesday or Wednesday to Saturday) each for 30 children aged between 8 to 11 or 12 to 14 in Bevaix near Neuchâtel, St-Croix near Yverdon and Trey near Payerne.

The normal parental contribution for a holiday camp is CHF 700 per child, excluding the cost of travel to Switzerland. However the SJAAS endeavours to offer all young Swiss Abroad the opportunity to

take advantage of our offers at least once. We operate a fund to which families may apply for a reduction in camp costs or, in justifiable cases, a contribution to the cost of travel. We urge parents to register their children even if the above costs may be beyond the family budget!
