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DAY 2 • 02.08.2002: Today we discover just how much Switzerland knows about time measurement at the La Chaux de Fonds Museum. On to Geneva, where Mercenary and Red Cross museums relate the history and legends of Swiss Abroad

DAY 3 • 03.08.2002: The splendid wine-growing region above Lake Geneva, with wine tasting, then over the mountains via Gstaad and through the Simmen

Valley. Visit to one of the last alpine farmers. In the evening we travel through the Bernese Oberland taking in Interlaken, Brienz, Giessbach. Romantic tales from the last century.

DAY 4 • 04.08.2002: Over the Susten Pass to the heart of Switzerland — the Gotthard, Switzerland's birthplace. Trip over the Gotthard in an authentic 19th-century mail coach drawn by six horses. In alternating stages depending on the number of persons. A unique experience. Evening: the historic castles of Bellinzona. DAY 5 • 05.08.2002: Trip to the Grisons and visit to the church at Zillis. The painted wooden roof dating from the 11th century is one of Switzerland's national cultural heritages. Evening: Appenzell, tales from another era or perhaps something completely different?

**DAY 6 • 06.08.2002:** The first manuscripts from the 8th century. St. Gallen's unique library. Arenenberg, the exile years of Napoleon III.

DAY 7 • 07.08.2002: Hapsburg country. This is where the history of the Hapsburgs began: an almost thousand-year-old dynasty which reigned over Europe: perhaps the first Swiss Abroad!? Mediaeval treasures, the convent churches of Königsfelden and Muri.

DAY 8 • 08.08.2002: Basle, the cultural centre of Switzerland since its earliest days. Alpine flight from Basle — an unforgettable experience. The peaks of the Valais and Bernese Alps almost within touching distance. Bird's-eye view of the Grisons and central Switzerland.

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
