SURVEY OF SWISS IN WA

In the second half of 2004, a questionnaire was sent to all Swiss in Western Australia who were registered with the Consulate General of Switzerland in Melbourne. There were 329 responses to the survey, from approximately 1500 registered Swiss families in Western Australia. Of the respondents, 41 were members of the Swiss Club of WA (SCWA), 270 were not, and 18 did not specify their membership. The response rate from Swiss Club members was 36% and from non-members approximately 19%.

The findings are summarised below:

- There was strong interest in fitting in with Australian culture.
- SCWA members were more interested in Switzerland and Swiss culture than non-members.
- A relatively small number of French Swiss people responded to the survey. They held strong views that the Swiss Club did not represent them, and was exclusively oriented towards Swiss Germans.
- A common theme from non-members was that the Swiss Club was too old-fashioned and traditional. They could get this impression from looking at the Club programme of events, which features Metzgete, Fasnacht, 1st August, Jass, yodelling, etc. However, the events the Club runs do not match the nature of the Club.
- People generally felt that the Swiss Club property at Rolling Green was too far away, but despite this, the consensus was that people liked it and the Club should keep it.
- If the SCWA had its own clubhouse, a majority felt that this would increase membership. A potential clubhouse should hold about 100 people and people would attend it about once a month. There was little interest in contributing to the purchase of a clubhouse, and there was lukewarm interest in volunteering services towards upkeep and maintenance. People were happy to share a clubhouse with other (preferably European) clubs.
- There was strong interest in going to a Swiss restaurant, but there currently isn't one.
- There was strong demand for Swiss German language lessons, for both adults and children.
- Interest in sporting activities was low, but bushwalking and camping were more popular than cycling, general sport and golf, in that order.

Consular issues

In general, people were very happy with Swiss ambassadorial and consular activities provided in Australia. Most people had interacted with the Consulate General in Melbourne, and were very happy with the service provided. However, respondents identified some areas of improvement in consular services, notably in reducing sexism in official communications by addressing correspondence to both women and men; and providing more information about the services the Embassy and Consulate provide.

Sydney - Aarau - Hitzkirch - Gelfingen - Mount Pilatus

We left Sydney all together on Friday 10 June 2005 and travelled via Singapore/Bangkok to Zurich. At the Airport we were received by some families, friends and some Alphorn tunes. From there everyone had a few days off, to overcome jetlag and get ready for the Yodlerfest. The preparation in Hitzkirch/Gelfingen LU with the local support of the Yodlerclub "Seebachtal" was superb and their hospitality and friendship first class. 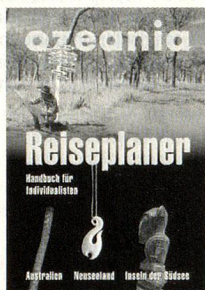

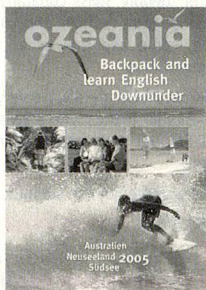


