News for the Swiss abroad

The Council for the Swiss abroad met for its Spring Session in the historic Bernese City Hall. Here a summary of the news.

President Georg Stucky opened the proceedings by presenting his presidential report which inter alia highlighted the following:

- At December 2006 Swiss abroad numbered 645,000 (Increase of 11,000)
- Of these 111,000 have registered to exercise their political rights
- The parliamentary Commission "Swiss abroad" is becoming more and more proactive
- The findings of Professor Linder re: "grouping" of political rights of Swiss abroad
- The Swiss Government's "E-Government" strategy
- Introduction of biometric Swiss passports
- Support from Swiss abroad for army reform
- Co-ordinating and rationalising the promotion of Switzerland abroad

 A revision of seat allocation in the Auslandschweizerrat will be ready by 2009

Colonel Elmar Mäder, the Head of the Vatican City Swiss Guard, gave a presentation on the "workings" of this "smallest Swiss security service in the world". Mr. J-J Didisheim and Ambassador Börlin informed extensively on the status quo of the Swiss government's E-Government strategy. Important for Swiss abroad is the future concept and creation of a "virtual consulate" in the internet, as well as E-Voting.

E-Voting for 2011 elections

Regarding the parliamentary elections that will take place on 21 October 2007, the Council adopted a resolution in which it expressed the importance of the vote for the Swiss abroad, as well as that it will be possible to have E-Voting for the elections in 2011. The Council's Executive Director Dr. R. Wyder informed that as from July 2007, the Council's internet sites, would

be "refreshed" to make information for the elections readily available.

The Solidarity Fund (Soliswiss) informed of new products for Swiss abroad. Please check with your nearest consulate for the latest literature in this regard, as well as regarding the availability of preparation courses for university studies in Switzerland by Swiss abroad.

The annual report, financial accounts for 2006 as well as the budget 2007, were presented and accepted unanimously by the Council. The Swiss government subsidy remains at Fr. 920'000 per annum.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for 17 August followed by congress on 18 and 19 August in Geneva with the theme "Swiss Solidarity in Humanitarian Involvement".

Pro Helvetia and Swiss Books will represent Switzerland at the Cape Town International Book Fair. Two Swiss authors, Nadine Hostettler and Daniel de Roulet, will offer readings from their works to the public in English (dates TBC by CTIBF).

Nadine Hostettler lives as an author in Paris and Zürich. She has published two books "Fräulein Matter verliebt sich" and "Die letzte Hemmung". Daniel de Roulet was born in Geneva, where he worked in the field of information science. Writing in both French and German, he represents two major neighbouring Swiss cultures. His recent novels are published in Paris and carry the genes of running and the colour blue: "The Blue Line", "The Blue Century" and "Grey-Blue". His autobiography"Double" (1998), proved that "life is mistaken identity". He will read from "The Blue Line" (2000) and "l'Homme qui tombe" (2005) at the CTIBF.

Helene Schär from the publishing house Kinderbuchfonds Baobab will participate in a workshop "Selling and buying translation rights: how to promote African fiction and non-fiction abroad?" organised by Frankfurter Buchmesse, covering topics like: foreign rights and contracts. The workshop is scheduled for the 18 and 19 June at CTICC from 09h-12h30. Since 1989, Helene Schär has been editor of the newly founded books series Baobab; children's book and books for young people from African, Asian and Latin American authors translated into German.




