Children were very much part of the event throughout the day: they enjoyed a Piñata and participated in an array of games, such as a tug-of-war, and three-legged races.

Following Swiss tradition, a fire was lit when the rain abated. Unfortunately, the inclement weather forced the cancellation of a planned lampion parade. Due to hard

work on the part of the coordinator of 1st of August celebration and the generosity of many sponsors, there were a lot of prizes for the tombola that was carried out throughout the event. Food and beverages were available right through the occasion.

Thanks to the assistance of many, volunteers doing an array of tasks as well as members of the OVSC Board planning and setting up the event, the occasion was a quite an achievement.

Ecole Complémentaire Suisse de Montréal

After 19 years, the École Complèmentaire Suisse de Montréal Inc. (ECS) closes its doors. The parting school committee has been entrusted with the decision over the "faith" of the remaining funds, in the amount of more than CAN\$ 13000.-, at the last general assembly on November 28, 2006. It was decided that the remaining funds will be available to any organization with similar goals as the ones of the ECS. Meaning, it needs to benefit Swiss children either educationally or recreationally.

To insure the proper dispersal of the money, we, the parting committee, set up the following conditions and guidelines, which will have to be ful-

filled in order to be eligible for the donation.

1. "Funds"

The remaining funds are to be in trust with the Fédération des sociétiés Suisses de l'est du Canada (Fédération) for a maximum of 10 years (until August 2018). The money is to be put up in a secure/low risk investment (ex: ING). All interests are to go to the "Fédération" for administrative compensation.

The status of the holding of the funds will be reviewed by the parting committee and the members of the "Fédération" after 5 years (August 2013).

Should no one claim the funds after a maximum of 10 years, the whole amount of CAN\$ 13000 will automatically go to the "Fédération".

2. Conditions and Guidelines

We ask for a business/project plan which shows in a clear and concrete manner the goals of the new organization - what the activities will be, how the organization will be administered/managed and which will show actual figures and calculations (financial plan) that proves the viability of the given project.

This project plan has to be passed and approved of by the parting committee and a member of the "Fédération". It will have to reflect the following objectives:

- a) Has to benefit children with a Swiss background, either recreationally or educationally.
- b) Has to be a self-sufficient, non profit organization.
- c) Activities have to be accessible to all children regardless of financial/economic background.
- d) Has to stay in Quebec
- e) Any individual asking for this donation will have to provide a startup capital of an equal amount as our donation (notably Can\$13000.-).


