Official Communication. Schengen/Dublin

Informative note on the implementation of Schengen/Dublin

The association agreements of Switzerland to Schengen-Dublin concluded with the European Union entered into force on 1 March 2008.

The philosophy behind Schengen is the abolition of systematic border controls among the participating states. Thus road traffic is no longer delayed; road, rail and air passengers no longer have their identity checked by border guards when crossing borders (however, security controls by carriers are still permissible). One common visa for one common area!

As the 26th Schengen Member State, Switzerland applies since 12 December 2008, the Schengen regulations concerning the issuance of visas. The visa will be valid for entering the territory of all Schengen member states. This will also apply to Schengen visas issued by other Schengen States which will permit entry to Switzerland. Being an active member of Schengen, Switzerland will benefit strongly from the important Schengen Security Information System (SSIS). This system will be - among other things - an important working instrument for Swiss authorities in fighting organized crime. Furthermore, being an active Schengen Member, Switzerland becomes at the same time part of the Schengen/Dublin Association Agreements. This Association Agreements enable Switzerland to fully participate in European efforts to increase co-operation in security and asylum question.

Editorial. Swiss Review Budget Cuts Confirmed

It is now official: A press announcement was issued on December 16 by ASO that the budget for the Swiss Review will be reduced from CHF1.8M to CHF1.3M in 2009; not the Christmas present we hoped for really.

In the press release, the Swiss Review was described as the "Schweizer Sackmesser" of the Expats living far abroad, providing a newspaper, political information media, and a forum for Embassies, Consulates and Clubs, all at once; not too bad at a cost of only CHF 1.25 per printed issue!

The 27% reduction in the budget now means that there will only be 4 issues annually (for 2009, they will be February, April, August and October); all of them will have the 4-page Regional News, so at least for us here Down Under, it will be business as usual, at least for now....?

Upcoming ASO Elections for Term 2009-2013

Back in November last year, a letter was sent out by Peter Meury, CSA Representative, to Swiss Clubs and Groups providing informing on the upcoming CSA election process for the next term. There are still some vacancies!

An ever growing Swiss population in Australia means that we can now fill 4 permanent seats within the CSA. Currently, we have 3 seats filled; Peter Meury from Sydney and Walter Purtschert from Melbourne both indicated that they would prefer to step down and let somebody else have a go, while I would be quite happy to continue for another term, given I get re-elected, of course. It is no secret that we aim for 1 representative in each of the major cities like Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Perth, or possibly also Adelaide.

As a CSA Representative, your role is, simply speaking, to "represent the interests of Swiss living in Australia within the Swiss parliament". Practically, this means that it is beneficial if you can attend the yearly "Auslandschweizerkongress" in August in Switzerland. The CSA Meeting is usually held 1 day before the congress start and it is there where we can have a say and bring forward our requests to the Swiss Parliament.

Throughout the year in Australia, your role is to listen to the needs of Swiss living here, give help and support in ASO matters like AHV cases, and provide information on what the ASO has on offer in general (like schools, programs, etc). Besides this, the most important skill required is that you are well connected within the Swiss community; for example you might serve (or have served) in a committee in your group/club, or simply have good connections to many Swiss living here. Please check the ASO website for more details on the requirements / election process.

So if you feel like this profile fits you, why not give it a go and send-in your CV to Peter Meury, PO Box 278, Budgewoi NSW 2262, or email petermeury@bigpond.com, or contact any of us by phone (list of CSA Representatives is on the left). We would like to wrap-up the election process by the end of February so we can put forward our candidates shortly after that to Bern.
