LETTER FROM THE PRAIRIES

On October 17, 2010, I will be stepping down as president of the Swiss Club Saskatoon after 31 almost uninterrupted years. I initiated this club with a simple letter inviting the Swiss of Saskatchewan to a meeting in Saskatoon in the spring of 1979. It resulted in the formation of a full-fledged club less than half a year later.

Swiss people are not usually drawn to a landscape that is so totally void of mountains such as Saskatchewan, and therefore, very few ever settled here. However, of those who did, just about everyone who was living within a reasonable distance of Saskatoon became a member of the club. This was a surprise as well as a real boon.

Then came another surprise. Before our very eyes, the members who consisted of people from all walks of life, who did not even previously know each other, began to bond and they formed lasting friendships. It will remain etched in my memory forever how, in spite of the group's wide diversity, people started to clue into one another's experiences, one another's hopes, wants and needs. This then became the foundation of a club in which a great deal of caring takes place. My own attachment to the members grew to the point where I gained an entire new extended family in Saskatchewan. What a gift! To think that at least in the beginning, the only thing we all had in common was the fact that we all originated from that beloved tiny mountainous country in the heart of Europe called Switzerland!

For over ten years now, there has hardly been any direct immigration to Saskatchewan from Switzerland. Gone are the days of the seventies when quite a number of freshly-baked Swiss professors were hired to teach at our two universities. And gone are also the eighties when a number of fresh young Swiss farm families established themselves here, bringing along their valuable education from the Swiss agricultural schools.

In recent years, the challenge has been to meet the needs of the second-generation of the original immigrants who now, to our delight, represent a high proportion of our membership. Without exception, these young people are married to Canadians and therefore English has increasingly become the preferred language even in our private conversations. As time goes on, this shift will become more and more pronounced. However, it is especially encouraging to observe that among young couples, it often is the Canadian spouse who is most keenly interested in passing on some Swiss traditions to their children. This bodes very well for the future of the Swiss Club Saskatoon.

It has been an amazing ride of thirty-one years. These years included no less than 200 organized events, maybe more. A big thank you to the dozens of committee members, whose work throughout the years was essential for the smooth operation of the club. To all club members I say, thank you for electing me year after year and for lending me your trust for so long. I am convinced that with members like ours, the integrity of this lovely club will endure for a long time to come. I wish everyone well.
