Swiss week in Mauritius

We look back to a successful first Swiss week in Mauritius organized by the Honorary Consul of Switzerland in Mauritius and the Embassy of Switzerland in South Africa which took place from 4-12 August.

More than 200 guests attended the opening ceremony. The President of the Republic, H.E. Mrs. Ameenah Gurib-Fakim, the Ambassador of Switzerland to Mauritius, Mrs. Helene Budliger Artieda as well as Swiss Council of States member and Vice-President of the Council of the Swiss Abroad, Mr. Filippo Lombardi, who opened officially the “Semaine suisse”. Both national anthems were performed by Swiss alphorn musician, Ms Eliana Burki. The Restaurant at Labourdonnais Waterfront Hotel was fully booked for the brunch which was prepared by Swiss Chef, Mr. Thomas Bösch. A workshop was organized by Air Mauritius for tour operators. Mr. Federico Sommaruga, Head of Swiss Tourism, gave a presentation about Switzerland as a tourist destination. Direct flights with Air Mauritius to Geneva will operate as from November 2017. Two Swiss films (“win-win” and “la petite chambre”), were shown

at the movie theatre Caudan. The Management Institute of Directors organized a conference on innovation which was opened by Minister of Technology, Innovation and Communication, Hon. Yogida Sawmynaden.

Around 130 people attended the conference. Mr. Walter Steinlin, President of the Commission for Technology and Innovation in Switzerland, and the President of the Republic, had a debate on key elements on innovation. The Swiss week ended without really ending. A feeling of prolongation, a longing to follow-up on contacts made, friendships renewed and for some lucky ones a direct flight to Geneva. In this sense I shall

resume and say “à bientôt”.

Ambassador of Switzerland lauds Swiss private sector commitment on National Day

On August 1, Swiss nationals in Zimbabwe celebrated the 726th anniversary of independence with the Ambassador of Switzerland H.E. Mrs. Ruth Huber lauding the role that Swiss private companies are playing towards the wellbeing and economic development of Zimbabwe.

Swiss companies operating in Zimbabwe include Nestlé, MSC Logistics, ABB, Lafarge-Holcim, Bata Shoe Company and Schindler.

“It is important to mention the private sector, as we all know the frame conditions are not very

favourable for attracting new investment. Cases of previous investors in agricultural production are unresolved. It is therefore important to acknowledge the positive contribution and the continued commitment of Swiss companies here present and the impact they are making through their knowhow, investment, production of quality products and job creation,” said Ambassador Huber.

Speaking on the improved bilateral relations, Mrs Huber noted that in February of this year Switzerland and Zimbabwe signed the Bilateral Agreement on International Cooperation that was further bolstered by the approval of a new Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC) five year development strategy for Southern Africa that will run until 2022. The SDC programs focus on the prevention of HIV-Aids and the promotion of Food Security. In Zimbabwe, Switzerland is also working towards strengthening of democratic governance, peace and security.

Guest of Honour, the Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs,

Honourable Edgar Mwembwe thanked the Swiss Government for the intensified cooperation with the Government of Zimbabwe and noted how this policy shift can be emulated by others.

“We are pleased with the number of development projects being implemented in the country with the support of the Swiss Government. This is especially so in the key sectors of agriculture, health and water and sanitation which have helped improve the lives of the people of Zimbabwe.”

“In the areas of trade and investment we are very satisfied by the continued and active involvement of your government which has resulted in the creation of employment,” said Honourable Mwembwe.

Swiss nationals and visitors at this year's celebrations were treated to various Swiss food and wine that included mountain cheese, dried meat, Swiss style sausages, Raclette and Swiss chocolates.

67 minutes for Nelson Mandela

The 18th of July is a day that has been pronounced as a celebration of the birth and life of South Africa's most humble citizen, Nelson Rolihlahla Mandela.

The Ambassador of the Switzerland to South Africa, Mrs. Helene Budliger Artieda, together with a few of her colleagues joined the Minister of the Department of Women, Mrs. Susan Shabangu, in the Office of the Presidency in doing their 67 minutes of charitable work. The day kicked off with a small breakfast at the Times Square restaurant in Pretoria and then the delegation of volunteers moved down to the basement to start packing food parcels for school children. Teams of 20 members each dedicated

their 67 minutes to a worthy cause and managed to pack 3 200 food parcels in their time slot which will result in enabling 15 children to go to bed with a full stomach on five meals a week for an entire year. The goal of the initiative, which was organized by Sun International in collaboration with Rise NGO, was to pack 3 million food packs for children all over South Africa and volunteers gathered in Pretoria, Johannesburg, Cape Town, Durban, Port Elizabeth and East London. The event was fun, rewarding and emphasized the spirit of team work.

In order to avoid any delay when applying for a Swiss passport, kindly register or keep us updated of the following:

- change of address or telephone number
- departure from consular district:
- change of civil status of any family members (birth, marriage, divorce, death,

adoption, change of name etc.).

- acquisition or loss of foreign citizenship
- Please send us your communication by e-mail (Pretoria: southernafrica@eda.admin.ch and Cape Town : cap.vertretung@eda.admin.ch) or use the online desk for Swiss Nationals residing abroad. You will find the link at the top of the website of the FDFA www.fdfa.admin.ch. With the online desk you have the possibility to access consular services, such as registering in the Swiss Abroad Register, notifications of changes of civil status, changes of address.

Regarding the renewal of Swiss passports and Identity cards, we kindly ask you to submit your passport application online on www.schweizerpass.ch. The Swiss representation will then send you an email with a link to its calendar to enable you to book your appointment. It is no longer possible to apply for your passport in person at the counter without an appointment. If you do not have any access to a computer, please call your representation and we will be happy to assist you telephonically. Please note that a regular passport can only be issued once your current civil status (birth, marriage, divorce, death, adoption) has been registered with the civil registrar of your place of

origin.

2018 Consular Consultation Days in Durban and Harare

Please save the date: The Regional Consular Center for Southern Africa (RCC) will hold consultation days in Durban on Tuesday the 30th of January and Wednesday the 31st of January 2018.

The RCC will also hold consultation days in Harare, Zimbabwe on Tuesday the 13th of February 2018. Swiss citizens will have the opportunity to renew their passport, as we will have a mobile passport station to capture the biometric data and discuss other consular matters. If you would like to take the advantage of this opportunity, please contact the RCC by e-mail southernafrica@eda.admin.ch until the 30th of November 2017. We look forward to seeing you and to bring consular services to your neighborhood.
