New Swiss Ambassador to Zimbabwe and Malawi accredited

Niculin Jäger is the new Swiss Ambassador to Zimbabwe and Malawi and has pledged to strengthen existing bilateral relations between Switzerland and the two Southern African countries.

On presenting his credentials to the President of Zimbabwe, H.E. Emmerson Mnangagwa at the end

of June, Ambassador Jäger took special note of the excellent relations that have existed between Switzerland and Zimbabwe since the country got its independence in 1980.

“Our relations with Zimbabwe are excellent. We are a long standing partner and we recognised Zimbabwe right away

from independence and since then our relations have been maintained throughout the years. I think they are going to be further strengthened in the near future and one of the major focus will be in the economic field,” said Ambassador Jäger.

Ambassador Jäger said he is looking forward to enhancing

Swiss investments in Zimbabwe, while applauding the resilience of Swiss companies that have weathered the various economic challenges and have remained open providing the much needed employment to the locals.

President Mnangagwa and Ambassador Jäger also deliberated on the President's recent visit to Davos during the World Economic Forum where he met with his Swiss counterpart; the Swiss Development Cooperation that has seen the relocation of the regional office from Pretoria, South Africa to Harare and the work that Switzerland is engaged in Zimbabwe, in the area of peace and democracy and elections among

others.

Ambassador Niculin succeeds H.E. Mrs. Ruth Huber, whose ambassadorial tour of duty in Zimbabwe and Malawi concluded in February 2018.

New Regional Director for Cooperation takes office

The Swiss Development Agency for Cooperation (SDC) Southern Africa Regional Office based in Harare has a new Regional Director, Mr. Manuel Thurnhofer, who takes over from Mrs. Julianne Ineichen. Mr. Thurnhofer joins the Harare office from Angola where he has been leading the Development Cooperation.

Swiss artist in residence in Johannesburg

Daniela Brugger (www.danielabrugger.ch) is an artist based in Basel and is in South Africa until December 2018 for a six-month residency between Johannesburg and Cape Town in collaboration with Basel-based residency organisation, Atelier Mondial (<http://www.ateliermondial.com/en/home.html>).

Within her trans-disciplinary work Daniela Brugger focuses on structures of society, investigating its forms and contents. Her works often include supposedly known situations, objects and material and concentrates on the ambivalence within the seemingly familiar. Her art practice involves different media such as installation, video, writing, drawing, performance and collaborative projects. During her

time in South Africa she will be exploring collaborations within feminist and self-organised networks and wants to develop a new body of work.

Brugger studied art education (BA) at the ZHdK (Zurich University of the Arts) and Fine Arts (MFA, Hochschule für Gestaltung und Kunst) in Basel. She has worked as an educator in several institutions, self-organised art- and socio-cultural projects and was co-director of Ausstellungsräum Klingental in Basel.

She is founder of Who writes his_tory?, a collaborative project that questions and works against structural discrimination online and specifically on Wikipedia.

Petition: Electronic Voting for all Swiss Abroad

The Organisation of the Swiss Abroad (OSA) is a private foundation founded in 1916, which represents the interests of the 751,800 Swiss abroad. It is launching a petition calling for the introduction of electronic voting for all Swiss abroad by 2021. Often, because the voting documentation arrives too late, the Swiss abroad cannot participate in the voting and elections.

This petition aims to enable the 172,100 Swiss people around the world registered on an electoral register to exercise their political rights.

The OSA hopes that at least 10,000 signatories will support the petition. The petition can be signed until 28 November 2018 and will be submitted to the Federal Chancellery on 30 November 2018.

Objective of the petition

To give Swiss abroad who are eligible to vote the possibility to participate in elections and ballots, respectively to exercise their political rights, which is often not possible due to the late delivery of the necessary documents. On 4.3.2018, 172,100 Swiss abroad were registered in a voting register, which corresponds with the electorate of the canton of Thurgau.

Who may sign the petition?

The Federal Constitution provides for a petition right: «Every person has the right to send petitions to the authorities; this may not result in any disadvantages.» Therefore, the petition can be signed by every person, irrespective of their age, sex, nationality or place of residence (in Switzerland or abroad).
