

VIP Meet & Greet with Swiss Athletes at the FIS Nordic Junior / U23 World Ski Championships

The FIS Nordic Junior / U23 World Ski Championships were held at the Whistler Olympic Park from January 27 to February 5. More than 530 athletes from 38 countries competed for world championship titles in cross-country skiing, ski jumping, and Nordic combined.

As Switzerland was also represented in Whistler, the Consulate General of Switzerland in Vancouver and the Swiss Canadian Chamber of Commerce (SCCC) decided to organise a VIP Meet & Greet with the Swiss athletes.

On January 28, roughly 20 SCCC members and guests made their way to Whistler in bright sunshine to support and welcome the Swiss athletes during the Junior cross-country ski sprint qualifying and final races. With loud cheers, Swiss flags, and cowbells, the attendees waited in the VIP area in the Cross Country Stadium to support the Swiss athletes and give them that final push over the finish line. Filled with excitement and suspense, everybody enjoyed watching the impressive sprints of the young athletes. In addition to the sporting spectacle, SCCC members and their guests enjoyed the VIP area hosted by Nordiq Canada. Fire pots, cozy blankets, delicious hot chocolate, soups, and sandwiches kept everyone warm.

After the final sprint, the attendees had the opportunity to meet and exchange some words with the Swiss athletes and trainers. The athletes very much enjoyed the Swiss support they received so far away from home.

It was a fantastic event with lots of new contacts, good conversations, great weather, and exciting cross-country ski action.

Everyone enjoyed soaking up the sun and getting some vitamin D. It was great to see SCCC members reconnecting with each other and getting to know fellow Swiss from the area.



In spite of all the Swiss fan support, on this day Switzerland had no medal luck in the Junior cross-country sprint finals. However, this was only the start of the championship, and during the week, the Swiss athletes did win some medals:

- On February 2, Swiss athlete Marina Kaelin won bronze in the Cross-Country Junior Individual Free 10 km competition claiming Switzerland's first medal:
- In the Cross-Country Junior Mixed Relay U23 race, Switzerland's Kaelin, Wigger, Weber, and Savary claimed the bronze medal.

Nous avons déjà commencé les préparatifs pour l'organisation de notre Fête Nationale Suisse qui aura lieu le samedi 29 juillet 2023, toujours au Mont Sutton.

En ce moment, nous sommes encore à la recherche d'un petit groupe folklorique venant de la Suisse, pour quelques heures de prestation, l'après-midi et en soirée. Pour quiconque a de l'information pour un groupe musical, svp communiquer avec nous à fedesuisse@gmail.com.

Notre comité s'est quelque peu renouvelé. Nous souhaitons la bienvenue à Valérie Martinez, notre nouvelle vice-présidente, ainsi qu'à Érika Schimann, secrétaire, qui a déjà fait partie du comité par le passé. Elles se joignent à Jeannette Perriard, trésorière, ainsi qu'aux administrateurs et administratrices, Silvia Baertschi, Barbara Gasser, Sebastian Hertner, Kenneth Hill, Urs Kaiser, Louis Savaria, Barbara Zaugg-Beugger.

Lors de notre assemblée générale annuelle, nous avons nommé M. Carl Diehl membre d'honneur et nous lui avons remis un certificat d'appréciation.

En 1976, au Chalet du Mont-Royal, a eu lieu une réception olympique pour les athlètes de la Suisse et du Liechtenstein. Par la même occasion, ce fût une célébration du 1er août. C'était la première fois que tous les clubs suisses étaient réunis pour un évènement commun.

Suite à cela, la Swiss National Society (créée en 1875) a nommé M. Diehl pour qu'il compose un comité qui devait trouver un endroit propice pour célébrer, chaque année, la Fête Nationale Suisse. Il devait y avoir de la place pour plusieurs centaines de personnes, un endroit fermé...comme un chalet avec commodités et stationnement. Et ça ne devait pas être à plus d'une heure et demie de Montréal.

Des recherches ont été faites en plusieurs endroits de la province, Laurentides, Outaouais, Montérégie, Cantons-de-l'Est. Lors d'un voyage d'affaires en Suisse, une rencontre inopinée de M. Diehl...dans l'avion...avec le propriétaire, à ce moment-là, du Mont Sutton...

M. Diehl et son comité ont visité plusieurs sites, pour ensuite prendre la décision que le Mont Sutton avait tout ce qu'il fallait et, en plus, était le plus pittoresque. Ainsi, à partir de 1977, le Mont Sutton est devenu le site où la plus grande Fête Nationale Suisse est célébrée, en dehors de la Suisse!

Quelques années plus tard, M. Diehl est devenu un membre du comité de la Fédération des Sociétés Suisses de l'Est du Canada. M. Carl Diehl, un chaleureux merci pour avoir trouvé ce magnifique endroit!

We're preparing for our Swiss National Day celebrations, to be held on Saturday, July 29, as always at Mont Sutton! Currently, we're still looking for a small folklore band from Switzerland to perform for a few hours in the afternoon / evening. If you know of anyone, please contact us at fedesuisse@gmail.com.

There have been some changes to our committee: We welcome Valérie Martinez, Vice-President, and Érika Schimann, Secretary. They join Jeannette Perriard, Treasurer, and Directors Silvia Baertschi, Barbara Gasser, Sebastian Hertner, Kenneth Hill, Urs Kaiser, Louis Savaria, and Barbara Zaugg-Beugger. At our AGM, we named Mr. Carl Diehl an honourary member and presented him with a certificate of appreciation.

In 1976, there was an Olympic reception at the Chalet du Mont-Royal for the athletes from Switzerland and Liechtenstein. It was also an August 1st celebration, and it was the first time all the Swiss clubs gathered for a common event.

As a result, the Swiss National Society (founded 1875) appointed Mr. Diehl to form a committee in order to identify a suitable location where the Swiss National Day could be celebrated each year. There had to be space for several hundred people - an enclosed area, such as a chalet with parking and amenities - and it couldn't be more than 90 minutes from Montreal. Several locations in the province were considered: in the Laurentians, the Outaouais, the Montérégie region, and in the Eastern Townships. Then, during a business trip to Switzerland, an unexpected encounter occurred on a plane between the then-owner of Mont Sutton and Mr. Diehl ...

After visiting several sites, Mr. Diehl and his committee decided that Mont Sutton had everything required and was also the most picturesque location. Thus, in 1977, Mont Sutton became the site of the largest Swiss National Holiday celebrations outside of Switzerland! A few years later, Mr. Diehl became a FEDE committee member. Carl Diehl, a warm thankyou for finding this beautiful location!


