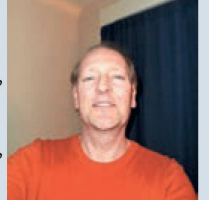
Editorial

Rachel M'Bon is a Swiss journalist, filmmaker, and human rights activist. Her 2022 documentary *Becoming a Black Woman* explores themes of identity and racism. It won a Swiss Film Award and the Prix Artopie at the Festival international du film sur les droits humains in 2023. The same year, the *Le Temps* newspaper named Rachel M'Bon one of the top 100 Swiss personalities of the year. She continues to film and write stories about black representation. Council of the Swiss Abroad / Conseil des Suisses de l'étranger

In 2025, a major innovation awaits the Swiss in Canada: the direct election of representatives to the Council of the Swiss Abroad (CSA). The first step will be to find motivated candidates. The CSA is the highest body of the Organisation of the Swiss Abroad. Its mission is to defend our interests with the Swiss authorities. The Council meets twice a year to discuss issues and make recommendations. Delegates also have the opportunity to engage in dialogue with Swiss parliamentarians on issues close to the hearts of their fellow citizens.

The following six delegates currently represent Canada:

- Thomas Arn, North Vancouver, BC (West);
- Antoine Belaieff, Toronto, ON (Ontario);
- Philippe Magnenat, Blainville, QC (East);
- Sam Oettli, Whitehorse, YT (West);
- Johann Roduit, Abbotsford, BC (West);
- Suzanne Schürmann, Mississauga, ON (Ontario).

To date, Canadian delegates have been appointed by local associations. To increase democratic representation, the Swiss associations in Canada have decided to adopt direct elections, joining ten or so other countries. **As of next spring, Swiss citizens registered with their Consulate who provide a valid email address will be able to vote for their regional representatives. The search for candidates is now underway.**

Eligible citizens may vote in one of three electoral districts:

- **East** (NB, NL, NS, NU, PE, QC);
- **Centre** (ON, MB);
- **West** (AB, BC, NT, SK, YT).

Profile of the ideal candidate: • Fluency in High German or French; • In addition to participating in online meetings, willingness to attend the Council's annual session in Switzerland (at the delegate's expense); • Unwavering commitment to the Swiss community and its interests; • Strong interpersonal skills to represent expatriates effectively.

Why apply? As a delegate, you'll have the opportunity to:

- Influence decisions that affect the lives of the Swiss abroad;
- Represent your community with the Swiss authorities;
- Meet Swiss people from all walks of life and discuss topical issues.

Important dates (subject to change): • January: Closing date for applications; • January: End of the electoral roll (deadline for updating e-mail addresses with the Consulates); • April / May: Online voting.

En 2025, une nouveauté majeure attend les Suisses du Canada : l'élection directe de leurs représentants au Conseil des Suisses de l'étranger. La première étape sera de trouver des candidats motivés. Ce Conseil, véritable Parlement de la Cinquième Suisse, est l'organe suprême de l'Organisation des Suisses de l'étranger. Il a pour mission de défendre nos intérêts auprès des autorités helvétiques. Le Conseil se réunit deux fois par an pour débattre et formuler des recommandations. Les délégués ont également l'opportunité de dialoguer avec les parlementaires suisses sur les enjeux qui tiennent à cœur de leurs concitoyens. Le Canada est représenté par six délégués au Conseil :

- Thomas Arn de North Vancouver BC (Ouest)
- Antoine Belaieff de Toronto ON (Ontario)
- Philippe Magnenat de Blainville QC (Est)
- Sam Oettli de Whitehorse YT (Ouest)
- Johann Roduit de Abbotsford BC (Ouest)
- Suzanne Schürmann de Mississauga ON (Ontario)

Jusqu'à présent, les délégués canadiens étaient désignés par les associations locales. Afin d'accroître la représentativité démocratique, les associations suisses au Canada ont décidé d'adopter un mode de scrutin universel, rejoignant ainsi une dizaine d'autres pays. **Au printemps prochain, chaque Suisse inscrit au registre consulaire avec une adresse de courriel valide pourra voter pour ses représentants régionaux. La recherche de candidats est d'ores et déjà ouverte.**

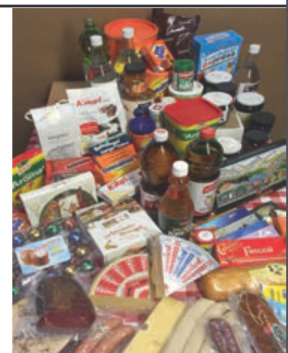
