## PART II

---

In Part I, an outline was given of relief to victims of the second World War. Following the system adopted in the two previous Reports, Part II will deal with humanitarian work in local conflicts which have occurred since the Armistice.

### I. — GREECE

The 1949 Report (p. 72) mentioned that the Committee had earmarked 280,000 francs to aid victims of the disturbances in Greece. This program began in October, 1949, and continued during 1950. Five thousand blankets, twelve tons of powdered milk, ten tons of rice, twenty tons of soap, 2,000 working garments, medical supplies, bandages, tonics and vitamin products were issued by the Athens Delegation. From June on, 77 tons of goods, worth 200,000 francs, were given to detainees in the Islands and prisons, and to refugee children.

In September, two refugee camps were visited: Syra (for Albanians, Bulgarians, Jugoslavs and Rumanians), and Della Grafia (for refugees from Rumania).

During October and November, Delegates visited other internment camps and prisons, and distributed relief. They went again to the camps on the Islands of Chiura, Agios Efitratos and Trikeri, and to Averoff Prison for Women, Sotiria Sanatorium, Pediki Estia and Kifissia Camps, and to eight penal establishments in the Peloponnese.<sup>1</sup>
