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Manuscripts should be submitted to one of the two Chief Editors: Dr. Jürgen Remane for geological subjects, Dr. Iwan Stoessel-Sittig for paleontological subjects. They will ask one of the Associate Editors to organize the reviewing procedure.

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The EGH publish papers in English, German, French and Italian, **preferably, however, in English**.

In addition to the full title a **running title** (max. 50 characters) in the language of the manuscript should be given and, if necessary, an English translation of the full title.

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Please observe carefully the following instructions in order to avoid a delayed reviewing procedure:

A – Please provide **3 copies** of text, tables, figures and plates.

B – Text printed on one side of the page in **A4, double spaced**, with 2.5 cm margin on both sides; foot notes should be avoided as far as possible. Manuscripts without page numbers will not be accepted.

C – Introduce printing types such as *italics*, **bold**, underlined, SMALL CAPS directly in the manuscript;

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E – **Abbreviations** should be fully explained when appearing in the text for the first time. If a great number of abbreviations is used, an alphabetical glossary at the end of the text is recommended.

F – The use of **paleontological names** (genera and species) should be in agreement with the International Codes of Nomenclature: names of the authors of taxa in small caps, use of brackets in accordance with general rules. First descriptions of taxa will not be mentioned in the References, unless the respective publication is also specifically quoted in the text.

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According to the context, the name of the author and/or the year of publication will be placed in brackets: “(Meyer 1930; Laubscher 1973, 1975)” – “as shown by Meyer (1930)” – no small caps here! If several publications are quoted simultaneously, they should be arranged chronologically by their date of publication.

When reference is made to a publication by **2 authors** the sign “&” should be used: Arthaud & Matte (1975).

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Publications are arranged alphabetically after the first author; only initials of the first names shall be indicated, family names in full.

The names of authors should always be mentioned in the References as shown above, no drafts to indicate the repetition of names.

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Tables, plates, and text-figures should be **submitted separately** from the manuscript text, captions placed separately at the end of the manuscript.

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Signatures and symbols should be fully explained in the figures themselves – please do not use numbered legends referring to the figure caption or to the text.

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Photos may also be integrated as text-figures.

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
