Instructions to the authors

Entomologica Basiliensia is a publication of the Natural History Museum in Basel and usually only original contributions based completely or partly on the material belonging to this museum will be published. Any paper must be consulted with the Editor in chief first and preliminarily accepted by him.

1. An editorial board will then decide on a definite form of acceptance of your paper. All the prescriptions of ICZN, *including recommendations*, should be followed *strictly*. All the contributions should be as concise as possible.
2. Only one set of (galley) proofs is distributed.
3. The spelling in the articles should be checked by the author, if not understandable, the paper will be returned to the author.
4. Any MS sent to the Editor must include: (1) diskette with the text file; (2) sheets with the printed file; (3) drawings mounted on paper sheets *size A4*.
5. Data about primary types (Holo-, Lecto-, Neo-, Syntypes) are required as a quotation of the original writing, i.e. re-written from labels and put in quotation marks; this is not obligatory in the other (lower) type categories.
6. The article should be divided into sections such as Introduction, Taxonomy, etc.; individual descriptions divided in paragraphs and should be marked as Diagnosis, Description, Remarks, Distribution, Etymology, etc.
7. The text file must be saved as *Word for Windows 6* or its later version. The Word files are subsequently exported to QuarkXPress. Such Word's formatings as setting tabs, tables, templates or styles *are not exportable* and are of no help to the technical Editor.
8. Authors are asked to kindly respect the following typing rules:

(a) Do not type: *any word by using Capslock*; multiple spaces; multiple tabs, multiple points, etc.

(b) Do not make any words expanded.

(c) Use single line spacing *only*.

(d) Strictly follow the rule that the authors typed in SMALL CAPS in your text are *only* those mentioned in your "References" section (at the end of each article). Do not duplicate a reference by using its abbreviated literature source in the preceding parts of your text *plus* its full citation in the References section below. The "References" may not be confused with studied literature. Each reference must be mentioned at least once in the text.

(e) Use only the code page Latin 1; the symbols which are not included in it can be expressed as combinations of two symbols, alone with their explanations (e.g. at the beginning of the text file).

(f) Symbols for the sexes make as "#" or "^" for male and "\$" or "@" for female or type them as whole words, *never* make them as e.g. "o" completed with hand-written marks.

(g) Abbreviations for all taxonomical novelties are used, in all languages, in a latinized form, e.g. "gen.n.", "sp.n.", "stat.n.", etc., with no space after first dot.

(h) Month as a part of date in a UK-English text should be written in minuscules, e.g. "1.viii.1999" (no spaces between dots).
